– Endorsed by 2007 Council on Legislation



“For the purpose of doing good in the world”

- Then President **Arch C. Klumph** proposed to set up an endowment in 1917
- The **first contribution** to the endowment was **from the Rotary Club of Kansas City, Missouri, USA** for **\$26.50**.
- The endowment is the precursor to **The Rotary Foundation**, the not-for-profit philanthropic organization that supports Rotary International.








Personal Giving v Other Giving By Country Group.




