VOCATIONAL SERVICE – ETHICS - ROTARY CODE OF CONDUCT

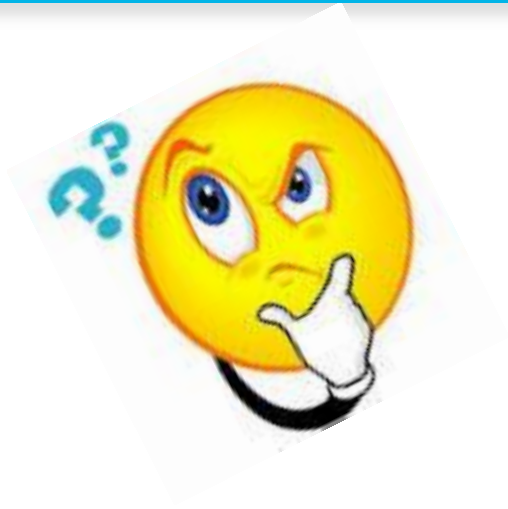
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5. Promote recognition and respect for all occupations which are useful to society;

8. Not seek from a fellow Rotarian a privilege or advantage not normally accorded others in a business or professional relationship.
