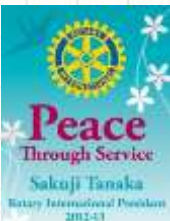

## A helping hand from afar

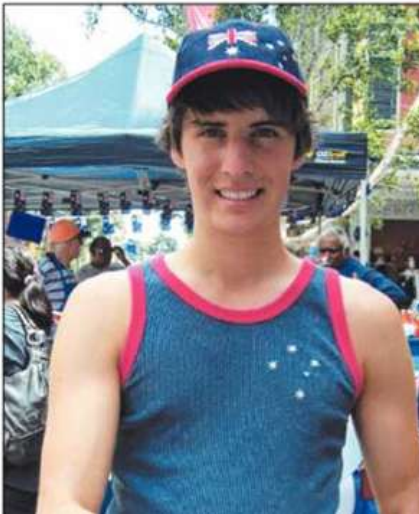

- The World Firefighters Games will be held in Sydney, 19-28 October
- There are 71 sporting events scheduled over the 9-day event duration
- Firefighters (full-time and part-time), rural, volunteer, SES, ambulance, aviation, military, and their direct family members can participate
- The Games Village will be at Pyrmont Bay Park. It will be a hive of activity (sports, live entertainment, catering) during each day and night of the event
- We are aiming to achieve 8,000-10,000 competitors over the period with 40%-50% of these being from Australia/NZ, and the balance from overseas



- **Our Games Village will be at PymontBay Park.**

# Australian Prostate Cancer Statistics

- 20,000 new cases each year
- > 3,300 men die annually
- 2nd highest male killer
- after lung cancer

# Australian Prostate Cancer Statistics (Cont.)

- One in ten chance of developing the disease
- Male deaths from prostate cancer = Female deaths from breast cancer
- Double mortality rate in the bush
