The Rotary Club of Queen's Park is located in a city of 300,000 and has 65 members. The rapidly growing city is expanding into the surrounding countryside, which serves as a habitat for several indigenous, endangered plants and animals. Though parts of the city are prosperous, about 20 percent of residents are economically and educationally disadvantaged.

The club's weekly meetings are well attended by club members, who participate in a variety of fellowship activities. Nevertheless, membership has declined over the past 5 years. During this time the club has lost 25% of its members and has had difficulty keeping newer ones. On the Resigning Member Questionnaire most complained that their expectations of hands-on community service projects had not been met.

The club's recent service projects were limited in effectiveness and scope. The two most successful ones consisted of contributing money to an organisation that renovated benches in a city park and making an unsolicited donation of playground equipment to a school in the neighbourhood near where several club members live.
