New legislation means that all Rotary Clubs and all Rotary members and volunteers must comply with Child Protection legislation implemented by the State Government. This legislation is broadly in line with requirements in all other States and Territories.

Club Presidents will need to ensure that members of their club are aware of and where necessary comply with the legislation when conducting Rotary activates involving children and young people. This process is a new one and replaces the current declarations made by club members and kept on file.
