Rotary Foundation Centurion Program

This is a very easy way of getting into the habit of making a personal contribution to The Rotary Foundation. The commitment you are asked to make is simply contribute A\$100 per year as long as you are able to. In this case, the money is paid into the Australian Rotary Trust Fund making your contribution tax deductible. The initial commitment is recognised by the presentation of a certificate and the 'Centurion' lapel badge, and each year our District sends out renewal notices asking all participants to continue their support.

This is not a large commitment and is a most important one in terms of our overall contribution to The Foundation. All Centurion contributions from Rotarians count towards the goal of \$100 million. The \$100 is made up as part of the District's contribution resulting in 50% of the contribution coming back to our District to use in our Club's Meeting Grant program and this can bring a greater level of good we can bring to people in need. Our District's treasurer Bob Templeman will be coordinating our donations and sending them to the District on behalf of our club members. - new forms will be available soon.

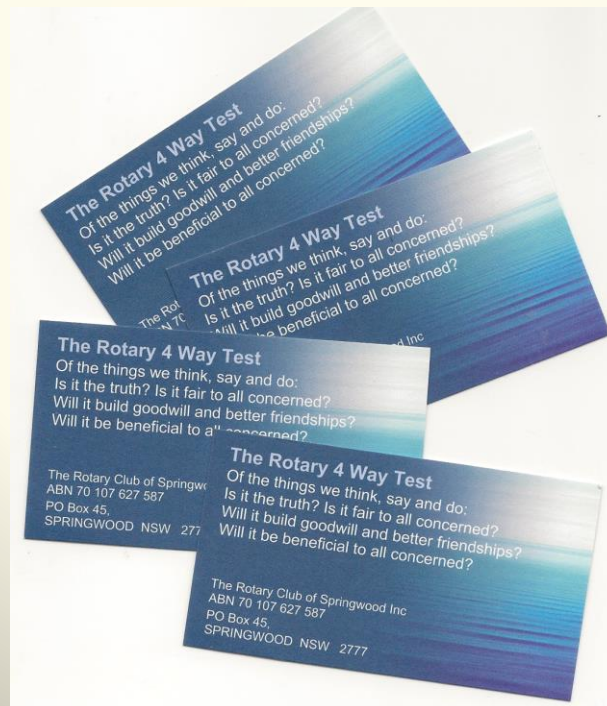

5) The 4-Way Test is included on the **Special placemats** at the **Pride of Workmanship Dinner.**

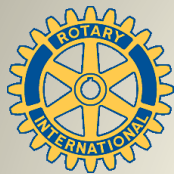
6) We have had **business sized cards** printed with the 4-Way Test wording to hand out at every opportunity.

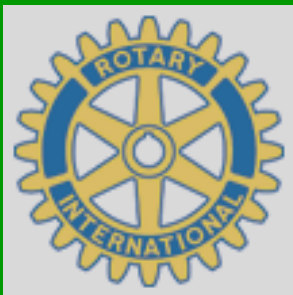

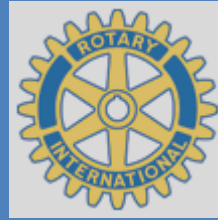

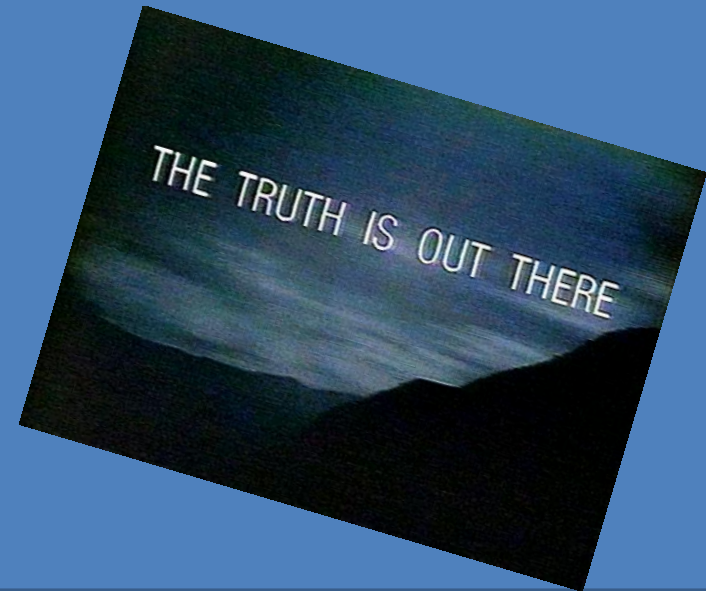
