Vocational Service Second Avenue of Service

Vocational Service is the manner in which Rotary fosters and supports the ideal of service in the pursuit of all vocations.



Inherent in the vocational service ideal are:

- Adherence to and promotion of high ethical standards in all occupations,
- The recognition of the worthiness of all useful occupations,
- 3) The contribution of one's vocational talents to the problems and need of society

History of Professional Ethics In Rotary

- Decision at first meeting 1905 members had to vouch for the integrity of new members
- > 1914 Code of Ethics
- 1923 Rotarians influence 145 National industrial codes of practice



- 1943 4 Way Test adopted
- 1989 Declaration for Rotarians in Business and Professions
- 2011 –Rotary Code of Conduct

Ethical Standards Rotary Code of Conduct



AS A ROTARIAN, I WILL

- Exemplify the core value of integrity in all behaviours and activities
- Use my vocational experience/talents to serve in Rotary
- Conduct all of my personal, business and professional affairs ethically, ... as an example to others
- Be fair in all dealings with others and treat them with the respect due to them as fellow human beings
- Promote recognition and respect for all occupations ..
- Offer my vocational talents: to
- Honour the trust that Rotary ...provide and not do anything that will ... or reflect adversely on Rotary ...
- No special deals for fellow Rotarians nor ask for such

Vocational Service - Responsibility

- Vocational service is the responsibility of both the club and its members
- Role of members is to conduct themselves, their businesses in accordance with Rotary principles.
- Club role is to implement and encourage vocational service by application to its own actions, by example and by development of projects that help members contribute their vocational talents
