The RAWCS Project 67 team has been working with the Rotary Club of Dili in East Timor and District 9500 and to establish a Rotary Youth Leadership Awards (RYLA) program since 2008. The concept of RET came about when we understood that our support for this young nation could be just so much more effective if our efforts to assist the people of East Timor were coordinated. How much more effective could we be if we connect rather than many Rotary groups working in isolation. Also. working together across the six Rotary International Foundation areas of Focus — Peace and Conflict Resolution or Prevention, Water and Sanitation, Maternal and Child Health, Basic Education and Literacy, Disease Prevention and Treatment, Economic and Community Development programs we can significantly increase our ability to "make a difference" to the lives of people in Timor Leste. 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The Biblioteka Ermera - Dan and Beth Gilfillen spoke about this wonderful Library Project to the District 9680 Conference in Wollongong on Sunday 18 March 28, 2012



Theme - <u>creating a window to other worlds through access to books</u>.

Ermera is an area the size of the Blue Mountains without a single bookshop. This library provides the chance for all citizens to get close to books and gain information and education.

Statistics regarding literacy are sometimes misleading: sometimes they just mean that community members can all recognize and write their own name. **Funding** - There are 130,000 people in the district of Ermera but many cannot access the new libraries. Lack of money, roads and transport are the cause. Four more library sub branches are planned over the next three years. Dan made a powerful plea for Rotary Clubs to consider a long term approach by **pledging regular donations**. Once the library is established it is hoped that management will be taken up by the National Library of East Timor.
