2. Communication Strategy for your Zone

Perhaps using ClubRunner as a vehicle

- Create Club 'positions' or skill-havers' who can be called on by other clubs members for advice on:
 - How to run a
 - POW themes
- Get list of successful projects/ideas that they could share with others
- 'How to' Leaflets on: ClubRunner, MyRotary, WWCC
- Club Visits, Board Meetings, Club Assemblies
- Phone Calls each month
- Newsletter Editors/Presidents on each other's mailing lists
- Emails with interesting links or tools (to Presidents) plus usual emails of official stuff we need to communicate

3. Paper-based District Directory

Pros

- Invaluable tool due to information available in first 40 + pages
- Simple fast access
- Convenient
- No major privacy concerns vs web based
- Face recognition

Cons

- Can't be updated once printed

- Not available to every member
- Cost

Improvements

- Update with information about social media
- Needs to show the names of Zone AGs on Club Page
- Obtain sponsorship for printing it
- Ensure all information is complete and all areas covered prior to printing

4. Electronic District Directory

Not mutually exclusive – both required

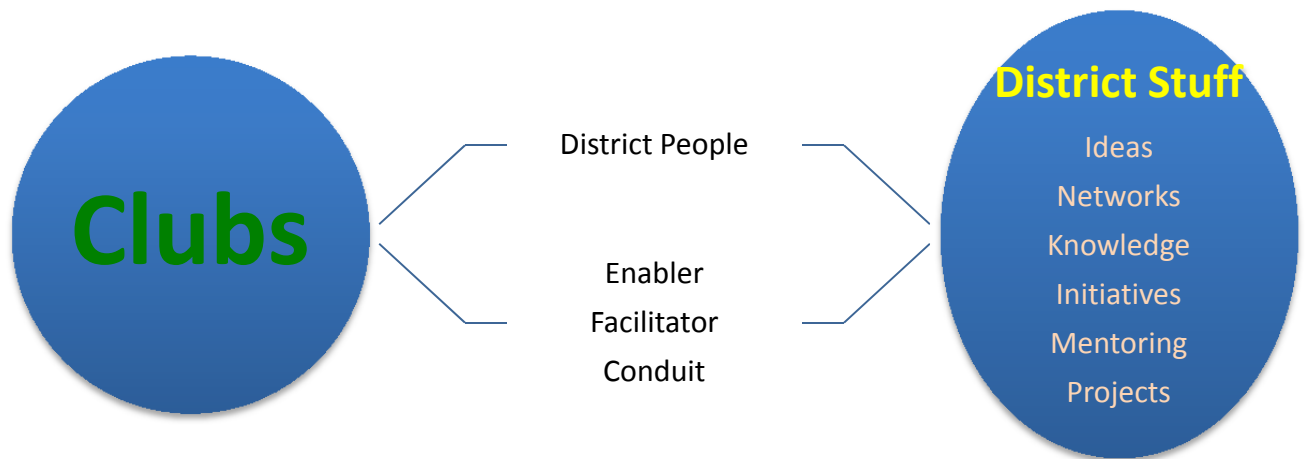
Pros

- Convenient for computer-literate people
- Easy to use:
 - Easy to access info
 - Easy to access, update details/cheap
 - Easy to Set Up User Groups
 - Instantaneous distribution
- Ability to link with Club calendar/ meetings
- More than Just a Directory – a “tool” for Rotary, District and individual members
- Free to use.

Cons

- Needs to be simple to use and easily navigable and searchable
- May not be easy to use = depends on lay out and program used
- May need training
- Need access to computer and internet and power
- Possible higher start-up costs
- Big job to get it set-up initially and data entry checked
