Ray White has partnered with Rotary Down Under to deliver an inspiring Christmas campaign for disadvantaged children who may need a little extra light in their festive season.

A Little Ray of Giving will launch on **1 December 2014** with local communities being asked to dig deep to put smiles on the faces of disadvantaged families this Christmas.

Ray White offices will have a special giving tree in their front window to collect gifts for children and families who will be doing it tough this festive season.

"All you need to do is wrap up your present and drop it under the tree in your local Ray White office. Tell the Ray White team if the gift is for a boy or girl, nominate an age group and your gift will be delivered by the team from a participating Rotary club to a child who will appreciate the lift to their festive season," Karen Hall, chief marketing officer of Ray White said. "It's a really simple way to put a smile on the face of a young child who might otherwise go without this Christmas. Sometimes just a small gift can make the biggest difference to families who are struggling at an expensive time of year."

Ray White has run this initiative across Australia and New Zealand each December since 2012. Last year alone almost 3000 gifts were donated and delivered to children in need.



LITTLE BLUE DINOSAUR

Foundation

The Little Blue Dinosaur Foundation was established as a memorial to Thomas Maxwell Davis McLaughlin. Tom was tragically fatally injured in a pedestrian motor vehicle accident whilst on holiday earlier this year.

The Little Blue Dinosaur is the face of the Tom McLaughlin Road Safety Foundation which aims to educate and protect children and their families from the ever present danger associated with roadways and motor vehicles, especially in holiday environments where roadways may lack familiar visual cues such as curb and gutters, pedestrian crossings, footpaths and line markings. Speed limits are very often set above 40km/hr around these areas where children are running about excitedly and may be momentarily distracted, forgetting their road safety lessons. Tom's loving parents are determined to prevent another family from going through the same tragedy by raising community awareness & promoting road safety education initiatives to children, parents and our community. The Foundation is affiliated with Kids & Traffic (Macquarie University), Transport for NSW, Gosford City Council, Department of Education & Training & the NSW Police Traffic & Highway Patrol Command.

In NSW, Transport for NSW report the following data relating to children killed or injured in pedestrian accidents as follows:-

0-4 years: 1 per week (80% male) 5-16 years: 1 per day (87% male) It is only by raising awareness & initiating educative road safety campaigns that we can make a difference to these staggeringly dreadful statistics.
