Events in and around Syria continue to dominate the news and the escalating violence can only lead to more innocent families needing to flee the country. The majority of refugees are not seeking a new life in the West. They are not economic migrants. Rather, they are families like yours and mine who have been forced to flee their homes due to state sponsored violence, civil conflict and the terror activities of groups like ISIS. Most would happily return home if the conflict were to cease.

In the past 3 years, ShelterBox has helped over 8,200 families in countries like Lebanon, Jordan and Iraqi Kurdistan and with the help of Hand in Hand for Syria, inside Syria itself. ShelterBox Australia launched its Syria Refugee Appeal in September 2013, aiming to raise \$500,000. So far, we have raised 44% of that target, with over \$20,000 donated in in the last 2 weeks. Thanks to our supporters, we have been able to provide ShelterBoxes, tents, SchoolBoxes, kitchen sets, blankets, solar lights and other non-food items to thousands of families. But the need is not going away any time soon.

Meanwhile, we continue to prepare for the next disaster, pre-positioning aid in the Philippines and Somalia. Only yesterday, we received a cry for help from flood-hit Sierra Leone

Syria - Conflict

ShelterBox has been working with **Hand In Hand For Syria** for over 2 years. Recently, a shipment of aid to support **1,000 families** in Northern Syria was dispatched from the Helston warehouse. **350 UN spec tents** and tarps have been distributed by the **Violet Organisation** in refugees camps along the Turkish border and a further **200 UN specification tents** are being used by the **International Organisation for Migration** (IOM) to repace worn out tents in long-term camps.



Iraq - Conflict

The UN has announced that the number of people that have been displaced by Islamic State in Iraq has now exceeded 3 million. ShelterBox has working in partnership with ACTED, and the Norwegian Refugee Council (NRC) to provide shelter to newly displaced people in Iraqi Kurdistan. Since 2012, more than 2,500 tents, along with various non-food items such as hat, glove and scarf sets, have now been sent to the Kurdistan Region of Iraq.



What is a Luminaid?

The provision of light after a disaster can be essential for safety and security. The Luminaid solar light provides a lightweight, compact solution, pumping out 65 lumens on the bright setting. It takes 7-10 hours to fully charge and will give up to **30 hours** of light on its low setting. Each ShelterBox is equiped with 2 Luminaid lights that pack flat and can be inflated when ready to use. The new batteries can provide up to **10,000 hours** of light. Solar lights can also be provided in bulk, as in recent deployments to the Philippines and Vanuatu.

ShelterBox is also busy in Cameroon, Nepal, Niger, and Tanzania.

The Operations Team is monitoring events in Afghanistan, DPRK and Pakistan, whilst planning disaster preparedness projects and pre-positioning in the Philippines & Somalia.
