

From the desk of District Governor Tim Lundell

These are very exciting times for our District 5170, especially in an area that is dear to my heart: Rotary education! For several years in the not-too-distant past our District participated in

Harriett Schloer's "Leadership Academy" for advanced training in all of Rotary's significant functions and programs. Each year 12 to 15 members of our District were invited to participate in the rigorous program, and many LA graduates proceeded to fill the important leadership roles in our District and beyond. However, the program had some gaps that we decided to try to fill with our own "homegrown" advanced leadership training. Unfortunately, the ALPS program, which had excellent content and dedicated instructors, did not gain the traction we had hoped for. So for this year, with my commitment to finding a new way forward with the critical function of leadership development, we have gone "back to the future", discovering the redesigned "Leadership Academy" program, which was rolled out to the District just four weeks ago by our Leadership Academy Dean, PDG Ron Sekkel. The response from veteran Rotarians and newcomers alike has been overwhelming, reflecting my belief that learning and leadership are intimately connected, and urgently needed for the growth of the cadre of future leaders. I look forward to celebrating the graduation of 35 students of the

Leadership Academy next Spring, and turning them loose to find their paths forward into taking us along into Rotary's future!

Throughout its organizational structure, at the global, district and club levels, Rotary pretty much starts over every July 1st. This is a good thing for bringing fresh ideas, initiatives and talent into an ever-changing world environment, but it does present some challenges. For one thing, it can take a few weeks (or even more) for new leaders and their ideas to get traction and momentum, to make connections, to deliver their agendas to the people who will make it all happen. Before we know it, the year is 20% gone! There is also the risk of each successive leader operating in a "silo", looking at his or her year as a standalone event, with little regard to what came before or what will happen next. In our District leadership, we have long been aware of the challenge of maintaining continuity from year to year, and I am pleased to say that our commitment to collaboration among the current and future District Governors, with guidance from our predecessors, is stronger than ever. It is our plan, in the months ahead, to emphasize even more prominently the "Three C's" in District leadership: Collaboration, Coordination and Continuity.




With summer months behind us, kids back in school, and people refreshed from vacations, Rotary is back in full swing, serving our communities with inspiring passion and dedication!

The District is managing a fixed number of rooms at the **Ameron Hotel Speicherstadt** via the RI Convention Housing block. Room rate is at \$275 USD per night (inclusive of tax) for Single Occupancy or \$299 USD per night for Double Occupancy. A two-night minimum stay is required.
