The District had a record breaking year for Rotary Foundation giving, with a particularly strong effort for Polio Plus. We donated over \$300,000 which when matched by the Gates Foundation, means we supplied over \$1Million to finally eradicate Polio from the world.



As most of you know, half of the money donated by club members to the Annual Fund comes back to the Clubs in the form of District Dedicated Funds (DDF). Most of these funds are used by Clubs to fund their local and international projects, often matched again by the Rotary Foundation, but the

District also uses a small portion to distribute Global Grant Scholarships. They are used to fund graduate level scholarships for students working on sustainable, measurable and needs-based community service projects related to one or more of the Rotary Six Areas of Focus. They are year-long grants for projects outside of the U.S. in collaboration with a host Rotary Club. Awardees are given a \$30,000 scholarship.

We are happy to report that we awarded two scholarships this year, since we missed last year. The awardees are Taelor Lewis and Sophie Stuber. Taelor, a graduate of Cal State Fullerton, will be going to England and Sophie, a Stanford graduate, will be going to France for their post graduate work. We had 8 applicants and these two awardees are definitely ready for the challenge of serving as outstanding ambassadors of goodwill for Rotary and for Making a Difference in the world.






