



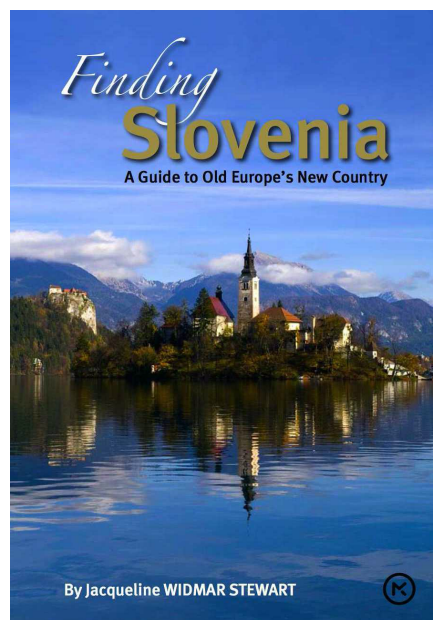
Jacqueline Widmar Stewart
