# From District Governor Angie Hassler

Happy New Year!!! I hope you all had a happy and safe holiday and have celebrated the arrival of 2014 with gusto.

January is Rotary Awareness Month, a time to help spread the word about what we are doing as Rotarians in our 53 clubs. Many clubs are great at getting their projects and photos in the paper on a regular basis as well as in the Social Media. Work with your Club PR Chair and District PR Chair Mitty Chang to get your club or a group of clubs some media coverage this month. At the Mid Year Meeting those in attendance had the opportunity to assess their progress with respect to achieving the goals they set forth prior to the start of the year and to renew their focus in the months ahead.

Many people make New Year's resolutions. They usually include things like taking better care of themselves, losing weight, etc., but many include things like giving back to their community, helping others and resolutions along those lines. These individuals are looking for us, for a Rotary Club they can participate in to fulfill their desire to help others and make this world a little better each day. Let's take this opportunity to find new members committed to service in our communities.

You might want to celebrate Rotary Awareness month by asking members to share a personal story or experience they have had because of Rotary. Every Rotarian has a Rotary story that can be educational and inspiring. The beginning of a new year is a good opportunity to renew inspiration for the balance of the year.

Our theme this year, Engage Rotary, Change Lives, strikes an important chord in the hearts and minds of Rotarians. The easiest way to engage Rotary is to bring a friend to a Rotary meeting or a Rotary function. This gives us an opportunity to show our friends who we are and what we do. As serious as we are in our dedication, we are also a group of professional and business people who enjoy being together and sharing a part of ourselves with others.

We are making a special effort to increase and retain membership in our District and there is no better way to gain new members than by asking them to be your guest at a meeting. It is sort of a reverse show and tell; more like a "bring and listen." The idea is to **Look, Listen, Decide and Duplicate:** 

- Invite your friend to a meeting so he or she can **Look** at what is going on;
- Listen to how we promote projects and programs in our community and around the world;
- Then **Decide** whether they want to join us. Too many times we bring our friends and never ask them to join because we have decided for them: allow them to Decide for themselves.
- After they are inducted and are part of Rotary, we invite them **Duplicate** and start the cycle again.

Rotary is not something that can simply be advertised with the expectation of growth. It is a concept that must be personally shared with those we like and respect and who like and respect us. This is how we Grow Rotary; we ask a friend. Do you think Paul Harris asked 3 strangers to join him in 1905? Of course not, he asked 3 friends. That is how Rotary started and how it has lasted and grown for over a century. To achieve our District membership goal (a compilation of what each club submitted for their individual club goals) we must have 63 (net) new members each month for the balance of the year. You said we could do it, I believe we can do it, so let's do it because Members Matter!





Courtney Wong, daughter of Ray and Patricia Wong of the Rotary Club of Almaden Valley, was selected as a semi-finalist in the Intel Science Talent Search (Intel STS) competition. Courtney, a senior at Leland High School in San Jose, submitted her project, "Scattered Light from Quasars: Connecting Observations with Computer Simulations" in November 2013. The Intel STS is the nation's most prestigious pre-college science competition. Alumni of STS have made extraordinary contributions to science and hold more than 100 of the world's most distinguished science and math honors, including the Nobel Prize and the National Medal of Science.

The semifinalists of the Intel STS 2014 were selected from among 1,794 entrants representing 489 high schools in 45 states, the District of Columbia, and seven overseas schools. Each of the 300 students named a semifinalist in the Intel STS 2014 will receive a \$1,000 award for his or her outstanding research. Additionally, to recognize excellence in teaching and school support of individual student research, every school will receive an award of \$1,000 for each semifinalist named in the Intel STS 2014. This award is used to further excellence in science, math, and/or engineering education. Congratulations Courtney!


