





vice Above Self, we develop a sense of purpose and fulfillment. We understand that each member has made a difference in the lives of people.




AN ACTION PLAN FOR MEMBERSHIP

Each Rotary Club should have a club membership committee that is responsible for recruiting and retaining club members. In order to provide continuity in the club's membership development efforts, consider doing the following:

- Make committee appointments for multiple years.
- Include a current, upcoming, and past membership chair on the committee.
- * Maintain open lines of communication between committee members and the club president, president-elect, president-nominee and immediate past president.

Rotary International publishes many online resources that can be downloaded. For a comprehensive description of the roles of the committee chair and members, see the *Club Membership Committee Manual*.

The *Membership Development Action Plan* has the following action steps:



- * **Introduce** prospective members to Rotary by telling them about RI's programs and your club's service projects.
- Invite potential members to a club meeting or involve them in a club service project.
- Induct new members in a dignified and meaningful way.
- Inform and Orient members by focusing on:
 - ♦ Rotary policies and procedures.
 - ♦ Opportunities for service.
 - A Rotary history and achievements.
- Involve new members in club committees, activities, fundraisers, weekly club meetings and social activities.
- Educate all club members so they have enough knowledge to take initiative and become active members.

2013 RI Council on Legislation Focuses on Membership

Rotary, an organization that has steadily maintained a world-wide membership of 1.2 million, is addressing the continuing problem of membership retention. "It is not that we don't attract new members," explained PDG Brad Howard at the July 2013 Cabinet Meeting, "it's that we lose a number equal to those we gain." He used the analogy of a leaky bucket: "We keep putting water in the bucket, but it maintains the same water level because of a hole in the bucket. Our priority is to plug up that leak so that clubs realize a gain in membership that is not decreased by Rotarians leaving the club."

A significant change adopted by the RI Council on Legislation was lessening the meeting attendance requirement. Rotarians can now engage in 12 hours of community service activities and events in lieu of weekly meetings in every six month period:

Additionally, the Senior Active category was reinstated so that Rotarians whose years of membership and age total 85 can be retained as active members without a weekly meeting requirement.

A variety of strategies are utilized to engage Rotarians. "When you are contributing, you tend to stay involved in Rotary," stated PDG Russ Hobbs, current Membership Chair. There are a variety of strategies to engage members:

- Link with other community organizations, such as sister city organizations and other non-profits, in service projects.
- Hold frequent socials so that members feel like part of the family of Rotary.
- Frequently recognize the contributions of individual members.
- Provide a mentor to a new member in addition to the sponsoring Rotarian.
- Immediately assign a new member to one of the active club committees.
- Encourage all members to participate in area-wide and District events to enhance leadership skills and involvement opportunities.

Our District showed an overall increase in membership during the 2012-2013 Rotary year. This increase is an encouraging indicator that clubs are successfully recruiting new members as well as retaining existing members. The question is, "Can we continue growth so that we attain our District goal of 5,000 Rotarians in the next three years?"
