LITHIUM BATTERIES are composed of various metals such as cobalt, copper, nickel, and lithium. These same metals are found in the batteries of smartphones, laptops, and electric vehicles.

"If we recover materials from old end-of-life products that can be sustainably broken down into their raw metals nearly infinitely, we significantly decrease society's reliance on newly mined materials," said Hung Wei, Rotary District 5170n Governor.

The Problem:

There are limited avenues available for responsibly recycling these old products. This contributes to the fact that some of the largest lithium and cobalt mines in the western hemisphere can be found in junk drawers across America as people stockpile these products without proper information on safe disposal methods.
