In the Grants session, we'll bring you up to date with the newest and latest information regarding District Grants, Global Grants and Scholar Grants. The Rotary Foundation has provided a crowdsourcing platform for clubs to raise money for Rotary projects – very exciting information for you grants folks, so don't miss it!

Letter from the Chair

District 5170 Rotarians,

Once again, I want to make you aware of the humanitarian tragedy that has affected Vanuatu, in the far west Pacific Ocean. Most of us have barely heard of it, but we are hearing now. Last October, PDG Lindsay Ford (pictured on the right), visited our district as a Partner in Service and his presentation included many images of the people of Vanuatu and the work he and his district are doing there.

On March 13, a Category 5 super storm, slammed into Vanuatu, destroying 90% of the structures and rendering an estimated 70% of the population homeless. It will be some time before the extent of the devastation to the outer islands of the archipelago, where



Lindsay does much of his work, is known. Lindsay has issued an urgent

request to his many Rotary friends, including District 5170, for financial assistance. An account has been established in New Zealand to receive funds. However, I am working with our District 5170 Foundation to be able to

receive funds from our Rotarians and others in the US. I will have details in the coming

days and will communicate them through the club Presidents, Secretaries and

Foundation Chairs. I know that Lindsay will be a great steward for our funds, assuring they get to where they are needed most.

Rotary District 5170 Fund Development Report 2014-2015

Annual Fund:

Annual Fund total giving to date is **\$679,826**. The Annual Fund Goal, as set by the cubs for 2014-2015 is \$692,670. With two and a half months remaining, we need only \$12,844 to meet our clubs' goal. The Annual Giving Total to this date in 2014 was \$683,346, which is \$3,520 higher than the current year.

Polio Plus:

Polio Plus contributions to date are **\$49,725**. The Polio Plus Goal is \$55,883. We have \$6,157 to reach our clubs' goal for the year. Note that District Governor Ed Jellen's contribution of \$12,500 DDF has not been transferred, so with the Governor's contribution plus additional anticipated cash contributions from members will allow the district to exceed the goal. Polio Plus contributions to date in 2014 were \$50,995. The goal for the 2013-2014 year was \$80,550. The previous year's (2012-2013) total contributions were \$94,626.

Fund Development Plan for the 2015-2016 Year

Annual Fund:

Increase the size of the Fund Development committee to include a Resource Leader for each area. This person will be responsible for tracking club contributions each month and for working with the club Foundation Chairs to identify opportunities for clubs to achieve their fundraising goal, attain EREY status (Every Rotarian Every Year). District 5170 is currently #2 in the Zone for EREY. Additionally, we will work with the Resource Leaders to identify potential major donors/benefactors.

Major Gifts/Legacy Society:

Create a new group in each area of the district, which will include estate planning specialists, life insurance and financial planning professionals. With input from the Annual Fund Resource Leaders, the District Rotary Foundation leadership and Zone specialists they will identify potential major donors and approach them to participate in the major Gifts/Legacy Society programs, whether through outright gifts or through some sort of planned giving involving their estate. Each group will have a minimum of three to four members – one in each specialized area, who will make themselves available to assist Rotarians with estate planning, insurance needs and financial planning services, if needed.

Polio Plus:

We will work to identify why the clubs' goals have been declining over time and assist the Presidents-Elect in setting goals and having a program to meet the goal. We will also examine whether the Mother's Day Card program has performed as expected and make adjustments, if necessary. We will also educate the clubs on fund development methods being used by clubs in our own and other districts/the Zone, in order to improve contributions.

Other:

We will work with club Foundation Chairs to divide their year into "seasons", so as not to confuse members about where their contributions should go. The above-mentioned programs are the three major fund development initiatives at The Rotary Foundation. In addition, many clubs have endowment or other capital campaigns. Working with clubs to segment these activities will hopefully improve the results for all fund development areas.

From the District Grants Chair's Corner

We are well into the second half of the 2014-2015 Rotary year and it feels like everyone is ready to wind down. However, there is still pending activity in Grant-land and some important dates and deadlines.

April 30: Club Spending Plans and MOUs are due. We have received many, but not all. How your club will use its DDF can be decided by the club or by the District. If you would like the decision to be made by the club, as well as complete one of the key requirements for club qualification, please return the completed documents to me by the April 30 deadline.

May 1: This is not an official deadline, but those who have pending global grants that would like them funded by June 30 should submit the applications by this date. During June, there is less staff available at The Rotary Foundation, which slows the pipeline for approvals and funding.

July 1: Global Grants in which cash is part of the financing will be subject to a 5% cash management fee and the budgets will have to be adjusted accordingly. If the cash contribution is not processed through the Rotary Foundation and the funds are submitted directly to your Grants Bank account, this fee will not apply. Therefore, we strongly recommend that all pending Global Grants which are intended to be funded by June 30 be submitted by May 1.

Note that there is a significant change to the scholarship program for the 2015-2016 year. Please refer to Marie Sikora's article in this issue of TRF News Today for more details. The District 5170 web site is being updated to reflect those changes.

Rotary District 5170 Scholarship Program 2015-2016

Significant changes will take place in the District 5170 Rotary Scholarship program in the 2015-2016 Rotary year. The District will begin a pilot which will broaden the program to include both upper-division and graduate students and bring the program within the reach of more clubs.

Applicants must submit their applications to their local Rotary Club for their sponsorship. Following are the highlights:

- 1. The scholarship is for the 2015-2016 school and Rotary year only.
- 2. Study may take place in the US or abroad.
- 3. Open to college or university juniors, seniors and graduate students.
- 4. The major or graduate work must be within one or more of the six Areas of Focus.
- 5. The program will be conducted through the District Grant program only.
- 6. Scholarship awards are a minimum of \$1,000 and maximum of \$5,000 per club/scholar, first-come, first-served, until the funds (\$20,000) are depleted.
- 7. Clubs may award more than one scholarship, subject to the \$5,000 limit.
- 8. The student application will be online.
- 9. The sponsoring club must interview the scholar and complete/submit a cover letter signed by the club President with the student application to MLSikora@earthlink.net. The District Scholarship Committee will issue the final approval.
- 10. The grant/scholarship will cover tuition and books only.
- 11. The student must reside in District 5170, although they may attend college outside the district.
- 12. All District Grant rules and deadlines apply, except as stated above.
