

SELECTION OF A DISTRICT GOVERNOR NOMINEE

Nominating Committee for District Governor (D5950 Bylaws 6.6):

The Nominating Committee shall seek out and propose the best available candidates for the office of District Governor-nominee and for the office of District Governor-elect, if necessary. The District Governor-nominee shall be nominated by the committee before the Annual Meeting in accordance with the Bylaws and Policies of Rotary International, these Bylaws, and any resolutions of the Corporation. The Nominating Committee shall consist of ten (10) members, as follows:

- 6.6.1 the current District Governor;
- 6.6.2 the current District Governor-nominee;
- 6.6.3 the current District Governor-elect;
- 6.6.4 the three (3) most recent and available past District Governors in order of succession;
- 6.6.5 one additional past District Governor at-large; and
- 6.6.6 Three at-large Directors selected pursuant to Section 4.1.7 above.

No two (2) members of this committee should be from the same District Club. All members of the committee must be active Rotarians. Any tie vote shall be determined by the vote of the current District Governor. Notwithstanding the preceding sentences, the DG, DGN, DGE, and Past PDGs shall be eligible for membership on this committee without regard to their District Membership.

Selection of a Governor-nominee:

The district shall select a nominee for governor between 24 and 36 months before taking office. The nominee shall become the governor-nominee-designate upon selection and the governor-nominee on 1 July two years before taking office as governor. (RIB 12.010)

The chair of the nominating committee is the immediate past district governor. Please contact with any questions.

Selection of Governor by Club Ballot:

The governor shall send every club an official call for nominations for governor. All nominations must be in writing, signed by the president and secretary of the club, and received by the governor by the deadline. The deadline shall be at least one month after the call for nominations. A club shall suggest only one of its own members. If only one candidate is suggested by the clubs, no ballot is required and the governor shall declare the candidate to be the governor-nominee. If there are two or more candidates, the governor notifies clubs of the name and qualifications of each candidate and that the governor-nominee will be selected by a club ballot. (RIB 12.040)

Submit forms/application/nomination:
