TRAINING 1

What is the training topic?	Training for dentures
What are the objectives of the training? Provide the curriculum.	<p>Objectives</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Increase capacity for Jamaicans to be able to provide dentures to their own people. 2. Increase number of dentists in Jamaica who can make dentures 3. Increase number of skilled lab technicians and increase skill level 4. Increase access to dentures to low income Jamaican population 5. Increase knowledge about home care
What activities will be done to support the training?	<p>Activities</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Rotary Grant will fund needed equipment and disposable supplies to complete lab already started. 2. Great Shape! and UTECH will provide expert personell to teach the art of making dentures to lab technicians. 3. UTECH will train students in making impressions. 4. Great Shape! will offer students ability to work in the field with volunteers getting hands on one on one training.
What is the length of the training? How often will the training be offered?	<p>Length of Training</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Dental students will rotate through the lab as part of their 5 year dental degree program. The average student will spend 20 hours of lab time gaining skills. 2. Dental Lab Technician will apprentice over a one to two year period for several intensive training session per year, each last one to two weeks.

<p>Who is conducting the training? What are the trainer's qualifications?</p>	<p>Bob Irlbech is a retired dental lab technician. He and other volunteer lab techs from the USA have been and will continue to travel to UTECH in Kingston to provide training to the lab technicians. Students will be trained by UTECH faculty, by Great Shape! volunteers and by the lab techs taught by Great Shape! Qualifications are years of professional service, degrees, certifications, etc.</p>
<p>Who is receiving the training? How many men? How many women?</p>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. 2 lab techs will receive training. One male and one female. 2. Each year, 20 dental students will receive training in the full denture process. The split is roughly 50/50 male and female.
<p>What are the expected outcomes of the training?</p>	<p>Outcomes:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. At least 20 to 40 low income Jamaicans a year will receive dentures directly through TRF sponsored project. 2. UTECH will gain 2 highly trained dental lab technicians who can train future generations of students. 3. 20 or more dental students a year will become proficient at making dentures – complete process. 4. The capacity for Jamaicans to provide dentures for their own will increase.
<p>How will participants demonstrate their new skills and knowledge?</p>	<p>The lab techs will demonstrate by making producing completed dentures and by training students. The students will demonstrate by making impressions and placing completed dentures in the field on the mobile dental unit or in rural clinic sites.</p>
<p>How will this training be evaluated?</p>	<p>Bob Irlbeck will evaluate the lab techs in written form. Dental students will have to show clinical proficiency in taking impressions and placing dentures.</p>
<p>Will there be follow-up training, communication, or observation of participants?</p>	<p>Dental lab technicians will continue to receive follow up training for several years to increase the skill level and ability to teach techniques.</p>
<p>Is this new training as a result of the grant or an ongoing training? If the latter, will this training be offered to new participants? Please provide a brief explanation.</p>	<p>Ongoing. The training of the students is ongoing as part of the UTECH curriculum. All new participants will gain from the funding of the project. Lab techs have started training through Great Shape! mentorship but will also continue to receive training.</p>

TRAINING 2

What is the training topic?	General Dentistry
What are the objectives of the training? Provide the curriculum.	<p>Objectives</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. To increase access to general dental care to Jamaica's most at risk populations. 2. To increase the general knowledge and skill level of Jamaican dental students to become better dentists. 3. To increase the number of providers of general dentistry.
What activities will be done to support the training?	<p>Great Shape! has and will facilitate rural dental clinics and with TRF will implement a mobile dental unit to reach very remote communities.</p> <p>The mobile unit and rural clinics will be staffed by licenced dental professionals from the USA and Canada. These clinics will be the "vehicle for Jamaican dental students to gain critical skills working one on one with Great Shape! Inc. volunteers.</p>
What is the length of the training? How often will the training be offered?	Students spend, on the average one to two weeks with Great Shape! in the field. Offered throughout the year.
Who is conducting the training? What are the trainer's qualifications?	Great Shape! Inc. preceptors are volunteer licensed dentists.
Who is receiving the training? How many men? How many women?	Jamaican dental students from the University of Technology in roughly a 50/50 split.
What are the expected outcomes of the training?	<p>Expected Outcomes</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Jamaican students will increase knowledge and clinical skills in general dentistry. 2. Will gain confidence and proficiency in work. 3. Will increase access to care to Jamaicans by training their own.
How will participants demonstrate their new skills and knowledge?	Participants demonstrate their skills and knowledge by implementing what they have learned back at the UTECH dental lab where they see patients throughout the year.

<p>How will this training be evaluated?</p>	<p>Great Shape! Inc volunteer preceptors will provide an evaluation at the end of the week. This evaluation will be shared with University faculty.</p>
<p>Will there be follow-up training, communication, or observation of participants?</p>	<p>Students receive continuing training at the school.</p>
<p>Is this new training as a result of the grant or an ongoing training? If the latter, will this training be offered to new participants? Please provide a brief explanation.</p>	<p>Both. Ongoing in rural clinic sites but NEW with mobile dental unit. For the ongoing, yes some 20 new participants will receive training every year because of the funding.</p>

TRAINING 3

What is the training topic?	Patient Training in Denture Care
What are the objectives of the training? Provide the curriculum.	Objectives 1. Increase knowledge of home care by patients. 2. Improve outcomes of dentures by increasing knowledge.
What activities will be done to support the training?	Great Shape! volunteers and Jamaican dental students will spend time with each patient when they are being “fitted” in how to care for their new dentures.
What is the length of the training? How often will the training be offered?	10 minutes. One time per patient.
Who is conducting the training? What are the trainer’s qualifications?	Great Shape! volunteers and Jamaican Dental Students. Either licensed dentists or trained in instruction.
Who is receiving the training? How many men? How many women?	Denture patients. 20 to 40 per year or more. Mix randomly.
What are the expected outcomes of the training?	Patients will know how to care for the dentures. Dentures will last longer. Patients will know to seek care if dentures need adjusting.
How will participants demonstrate their new skills and knowledge?	Trainers will ask patients to repeat care instructions.

<p>How will this training be evaluated?</p>	<p>By the dentist listening to the patient.</p>
<p>Will there be follow-up training, communication, or observation of participants?</p>	<p>No.</p>
<p>Is this new training as a result of the grant or an ongoing training? If the latter, will this training be offered to new participants? Please provide a brief explanation.</p>	<p>Yes, a result of the grant.</p>
