### Leadership Fellows Program Registration, Payment and Cancellation Policy

The tuition for the 2019 Leadership Fellows Program is \$1,000. You will make your payment online by credit card only. The entire tuition amount is due on or before June 1, 2019. You will be given payment instructions in your welcome email after you register.

Students may register after June 1, 2019, and on or before August 1, 2019, for a tuition fee of \$1,200, if space is available. This fee is due and payable on or before August 1, 2019. No students will be accepted into this cohort after August 1, 2019.

We will accept 25 students for 2019 cohort of the Leadership Fellows Program. After the first 25 students are registered and paid, we will create a waitlist for students who are interested but are not able to register. Waitlisted students will be able to attend if a registered student drops out or does not pay by the established deadlines. Waitlisted students will be eligible on a first-come, first-served basis. They will pay a registration fee based on their waitlisted date.

If a registered student cancels on or before August 1, 2019, for any reason, they will be refunded their entire registration fee less a 10% administrative fee.

## Rotary: The Response

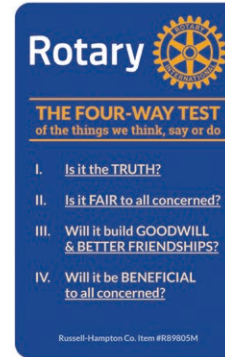
