His other Rotary passion is RYLA, where in 2002, he helped develop the first Young RYLA program (a RYLA for middle school students) and served as the second Young RYLA Chair in 2003. Since 2007, he has been involved with RYLA, serving as Chair three times and as Treasurer of Rocky Mountain RYLA for six years. Finally, Curt served as District 5450, Area 8 Assistant Governor for three years.

In 1979, Curt began a career with the local FirstBank. During his career, Curt held many different positions including Auditor, Chair of the Credit Administration Department, Chairman of the Loan Committee, Compliance Officer and Bank President. He has served on various non-profit boards including the Seniors' Resource Center Yellow House Advisory Committee, the Mountain Area Land Trust and Arapahoe House. Jake Norton is a world-renowned climber, photographer, filmmaker, philanthropist, and inspirational speaker. Based in Evergreen, Colorado, Jake's worldwide adventures have taken him to the summit of Mount Everest (three times) and on expeditions on all seven continents.

His photography has appeared in publications such as Vanity Fair, National Geographic, Forbes, and Oprah, while his film footage has been used in documentaries and television series.

As a speaker, Jake has inspired tens of thousands of people and companies worldwide to reach new summits and enjoy their climb to the top. He is also a sought-after trainer, conducting highly interactive full and half day leadership and teamwork workshops for corporations and associations.

Rotary Connects – Mental Health Initiative in Response to COVID-19 **Seth Patterson (Denver Rotary Club)**

Rotarians for Mental Health took action and obtained a \$20,000 Disaster Response Grant from the Rotary Foundation, resulting in Rotary Connects, a new program providing cell phones to vulnerable Clients and connecting them to their therapists at nine Colorado Mental Health Centers.

Rotary and Metro Caring: Feeding the Hungry During the Pandemic **Joel Russman (Denver Cherry Creek Rotary Club)**

The club is providing 20,000 square feet of warehouse space and has set up running the facility with volunteers. The volunteers break down food staples in 1 pound bags for distribution through Metro Caring's Food Bank.

Jeff Radigan **NASA Flight Director** *Developments in Human Spaceflight*

Jeff Radigan began his career at Johnson as a member of the station flight control team assigned to the electrical power system. After completing his flight control certification, he gained extensive experience serving as the electrical power system operations lead in various roles, including the first station battery replacement that occurred during the STS-127 mission of space shuttle Endeavour in 2009.

Jeff transitioned to a Mission Operations program integration role where his responsibilities included coordinating a multitude of technical and operational positions and representing those positions to external programs. He worked extensively on the verification of the first commercial vehicle to the space station and has participated in the operations work for commercial crew transportation. In addition to his program integration duties, Jeff serves as an operations safety engineer, which includes co-chairing the Safety review panels and reviewing and approving hazard reports.

Jeff originally is from Sylvania, Ohio, and earned a bachelor's and master's degrees in electrical engineering from Ohio State University.

Erik Weihenmayer *Soar to the Top*

Erik, from Golden Colorado, is the first person without sight to reach the summit of Mount Everest, on May 25, 2001. For this feat, he was honored with a Time magazine cover story. He also completed the Seven Summits in September 2002, joining 150 mountaineers at the time who had accomplished that feat, but as the only climber who was blind.

Before losing his sight, Erik was a 5th grade teacher for the Phoenix Country Day School. Since then he has pushed himself through the barriers of blindness to become a world-renowned athlete, activist, motivational speaker, and author. He has written two books, *No Barriers* and *Touch the Top of the World*.

Erik believes, “your ultimate value is when you take the gifts earned through your struggles and use them to elevate your community and be a leader who serves.”

Beyond his speaking engagements Erik has made it his life’s work to empower those who are marginalized and pushed to the sidelines to find purpose and fulfillment in their lives. In 2005, he co-founded No Barriers, a nonprofit organization with the tagline, “What’s Within You is Stronger Than What’s in Your Way.” The organization helps people of diverse backgrounds and abilities develop a No Barriers Mindset – to attack challenges head on, problem solve build winning teams and serve others.

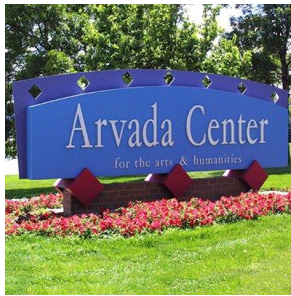
