This long-time Golden Rotarian regularly supports the "Ethics in Business" Luncheon celebrating the most ethical business and nonprofit in the greater Golden community. He teaches the 4-Way Test to students of Connections Learning Center, an options program of the Jefferson County Public School system. This year, following a week as a Rotarian/Counselor with Young RYLA he redesigned his club's 4-Way Test program by merging core values with the 4-Way Test that embedded the concept of values based decision making into the lives of at risk youth.

He has served on his club's membership team as mentor to new members and guiding potential members through "Rotary College." A long-term member of the Vocational Committee, he continues his work with the Excellence in Arts Award, which he founded. He teaches interview skills to students of Warren Tech. He is guiding the formation of his club's new satellite and continues his support of Young RYLA as a Rotarian/Counselor. He has served as the PR Chair and continues to generate broad community awareness about the Rotary Club of Golden. Perhaps the most important role that this Rotarian has played the past two years is as our District's Ombudsman, providing wisdom and counsel to many in difficult circumstances that result in solutions fair and beneficial to all concerned.
