

Foundation Giving 6/8/11 Goals of RI Foundation 2011-12 from July Rotarian Magazine - Bill Boyd

- Complete Eradication of Polio
 - Cannot relax as seen in recent outbreaks
- Every Rotarian should feel that they own a part of the Foundation.
 - We do that through our service and contributions
- Make our Foundation more effective and efficient by testing and refining our future Vision Plan
 - This is a preparation year for Future Vision at club and District Level for non-pilot districts

How The Rotary Foundation Works





The Charts simplified

- Giving this year is returned from investing in 3 years
- 50% is returned to the district as District Designated funds (DDF)
 - This can be spent on Ambassadorial Scholars, extra GSE teams, District Simplified grants to a maximum of 20%, and International Matching Grants or other ways.
 - Unused funds can rollover to following years
- 50 % is kept by International in the World Fund
 - Funds Educational & Humanitarian Programs
 - Educational Scholars
 - Group Study Exchange 1/2 to each district
 - Matching Grants
 - 3-H when Investments allow

RI Foundation Giving Designations

- ANNUAL GIVING All contributions support SHARE
- 50% to District Designated Fund
- 50% to World Fund Counts toward Club and District APF Goal
- Counts toward Annual Giving Per Capita
- PHF recognition available

RESTRICTED GIVING - Supports program selected by donor

- Matching Grants PolioPlus PolioPlus Partners World
 Fund Other Approved Programs
- Does not count towards Club or District APF Goal
- Does not count towards Annual Giving Per Capita

PERMANENT FUND - Contributions are never spent

- Earnings are spent on programs
- Donor can designate earnings for
- SHARE World Fund Other (major gifts only)
- Benefactor recognition available
- Does not count towards Club or District APF Goal
- Does not count towards Annual Giving Per Capita

Polio Plus

- Goal eradication of polio by Dec 2012
- Worldwide as of June 2011 RI raised
 \$175M of \$200M of Gates matching Grant
- District last 4 years raised \$594K or 108% of our goal of \$175 per rotarian
- 42 clubs exceeded goal
 - Arvada top \$534 per member
- Goal of District 2011-2012 raise another \$50,000 thru community awareness events

Permanent Funds recognition

- Benefactor is \$1,000 or more gift or provision in their estate to Permanent fund
- Bequest Society is \$10,000 or more by individuals or couples who have made commitments in their estate

 Gifts to Permanent fund can be designated for SHARE or World fund

 World Peace Scholar donors to raise permanent endowment to \$100 Million

Permanent and restricted giving 2010-2011


- Restricted giving \$275,386

Giving now is important

- In 2002, when the stock market was down, 70 percent of the population in the USA gave an average of \$2000. Rotarians can match 70% of the population.
- Remember what you give this year affects what we have to spend in 3 years.
- Plan what you can afford to give every year and then implement a way to make sure you give every year with an increase.
- Use matching points to get your Paul Harris fellow and help others in your clubs.

How to increase Annual Giving

- For those who say they cannot afford to give, setup a fund raiser run by those members and split the proceeds between those participating
- Encourage members to quickly get their Paul Harris Fellow levels
- Use matching points to reach those levels
- Become EREY club
- Become EREY Sustaining club
- Become Paul Harris Fellow club

How to contribute

- Club Dues
 - Send in end of each quarter using Multiple Donor Form
- Online
- Recurring Gift Form-Credit card or direct from Bank Account
- Rotary Credit card for Polio

Food for Thought

- Only about 25% of our district Rotarians give \$100 or more.
- Last year 3 clubs gave nothing!
- Approximately %50 of our Rotarians give nothing to annual giving!
- We are at a per capita giving level of \$126, last year we were at \$153!
- But We are the best in our zone and were last year.
- Our District gave \$1,552,196 in 2009-2011, due to Polio & Benefactor giving. \$682,015 last year 2010-11

How did WP/FV Rotary do?

- Met Polio Challenge \$5250.00
- Annual Giving as of 2010-11 \$5575.00
 - Per Capita \$179.84
- Every Rotarian Every year
 - 12 of 31 members
 - 11 of 31 Sustaining (minimum \$100 in year)
- 3 Paul Harris society (\$1000 in year)
- No giving to Permanent fund
- Club has 11 Paul Harris Fellows
- Bequest and Benefactors

- Smoky Hills \$449.42
- Parker \$329.24
- Arvada Sunrise \$290.13

• WP/FV \$179.84 - 13th

How could we meet \$1M /yr

- 32 members
- We have 3 PHS \$3000 goal met!!
- We have 7 EREY need 15 at \$120 per year - \$1800
- We have 1 DAD need 15 at \$300 per year
 \$4500

 Total \$9300 or \$290.63 and we would have been in 3rd place this year

Set goals for our club

- Become an EREY Sustaining club every year - Everyone commit to minimum \$120 per year
- Make any new member a PHF within 1st year of joining thru points and matching contributions. Become a Paul Harris Fellow club.
- Every member fill out a pledge at beginning of year on level and how to give.
 Will be reminded by Club RI Foundation chair

How do we do it annually

- Every rotarian in club be at least \$120/yr
- 15 of you become \$300/yr DAD's
- 3 members become yearly PHS regularly \$1000 /yr sustained
- How to give:
- EREY \$30 per quarter in club dues easiest
- DAD \$75 per quarter in club dues or go online and give
- PHS however you want Most do it online

Additional tips

 If you cannot afford to give personally to meet your goal, participate in special fund raiser with others like you just for this purpose.

 Fund raiser could be also to help everyone become Paul Harris Fellow ASAP.
