In 1987 the University Hills Rotary Club of Denver inaugurated the Les Bevans Pacesetter Award to recognize a district Rotarian who has contributed significantly to the ideal of Vocational Service in her or his community.

The Second Object of Rotary calls for "the dignifying by each Rotarian of his or her occupation as an opportunity to serve society". Typified by the actions of our late Club member and Past District Governor Les Bevans it is in his name/honor that we created this award. We want to recognize and honor a Rotarian whose service, through involvement and by example in her or his vocation has been exceptional.

The Vocational Service Committee of the University Hills Rotary Club is now seeking nominations for this prestigious award. The recipient of the award will be honored during the Awards Banquet at the District Conference with a Paul Harris Fellow award and a handsome engraved memento.

Who may be a Candidate?

The nominee must be a Rotarian and a member of a District 5450 Rotary Club. This person needs to exhibit the highest standards of Vocational Service – one who has performed valuable Vocational Service to the business of Rotary, the public and/or both during the past year:

1. One who has made a significant contribution to the business of Rotary for the betterment of fellow Rotarians and the public her/his Rotary serves;
2. One who transforms a way of making a living into a way of living a life in an ethical, honorable and upright manner;
3. One who is improving the quality of life in the professions and in trade, industry and/or commerce;
4. One who is implementing responsibility to make business and industry a better place to work and of more service to the community; and
5. One who hold the 4-Way Test as a set of values for her/his personal and business life.
