Rotary and Gates Foundation Extend Fundraising Agreement to End Polio

New match arrangement could raise \$525 million for global eradication effort

Rotary International and the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation announced an extension of their existing fundraising partnership that could generate up to \$525 million in new money for polio eradication as the global effort to end this crippling disease enters its critical endgame phase.

Under the new agreement, announced before an audience of more than 20,000 Rotary members from 160 countries gathered in Lisbon for the humanitarian group's annual convention, the Gates Foundation will match 2 for 1 every new dollar Rotary commits to polio eradication up to \$35 million per year through 2018.

"When Rotarians combine the passion for service along with the power of a global network, you are unstoppable, and the Gates Foundation is proud to partner with you," said Gates Foundation CEO Jeff Raikes. "We will combine the strength of Rotary's network with our resources and together with the other partners in the Global Polio Eradication Initiative we will not only end a disease, we will change the face of public health forever."

Rotary and the Gates Foundation have partnered on polio eradication since 2007, when the Gates Foundation gave Rotary a

\$100 million challenge grant for polio eradication, increasing it to \$355 million in 2009. Rotary agreed to raise \$200 million in matching funds by June 2012. When the organization achieved its fundraising goal six months ahead of schedule, the Gates Foundation granted Rotary an additional \$50 million.

To date, Rotary clubs worldwide have contributed \$1.2 billion to the polio eradication effort.

"We're at a critical point in the fight to end polio," said Past Rotary Vice President John Germ, who leads the organization's fundraising efforts for polio eradication. "We must capitalize on this progress to finish the job. We have a robust plan, the tools to reach each child, and with funding in place, we can win against this devastating disease.

Germ also announced a new contribution of \$1 million from Sir Emeka Offor, a Nigerian Rotarian and philanthropist, as one of the first major gifts to be matched under the new agreement with Gates.

District Rotary Award Travels on Cruise Ship

Shortly after the 2010 earthquake in Haiti PDG Mike McCarthy conducted our annual district conference on Royal Caribbean's cruise ship, The Explorer of the Seas. D7430 Rotarians purchased, packed and delivered five pallets of backpacks for Haitian school students, and Royal Caribbean transported them to Labadee, Haiti at no charge.



The following year PDG Mike and DGE Bill Jahn traveled to Cape Liberty, Bayonne, NJ, and again boarded that ship and met with Captain Olav Gunnar Nyseter, the same Captain who took us to Haiti in 2010. They presented him with a plaque thanking Royal Caribbean for its generosity.



Over the 4th of July, 2013, PDG Bill Palmer with his family cruised on that same ship and with the same Captain. The D7430 plaque is on full display on the wall of the public space on deck 11 leading to the food. PDG Bill met with Captain Olav on the 4th to again say "Thank You" to Royal Caribbean from D7430.

New Email Scams Target Rotarians



Several U.S. Rotarians have recently reported receiving an email with the subject line: "Awful Trip!!! (Urgent Help Needed)" It fraudulently claims to be from RI President Ron Burton, reporting he is in Valencia, Spain, and in urgent need of money to replace stolen cash, cards, etc. The email was apparently sent by an unauthorized access to one of

his email accounts. RI staff is working to resolve the issue; but please be aware the email is a scam.

Also be aware of Facebook pages or other websites using the Rotary logo without permission in order to solicit money and imply a relationship with Rotary.

Other recent scams include:

•Fraudulent emails with the subject line "Rotary Membership Update" that reports to be from Rotary International asking them to update their membership status for the 2013 year by clicking on the link supplied in the email. Please be aware that this is a phishing scam. Phishing is the criminally fraudulent act of attempting to acquire sensitive information such as usernames, passwords, or credit card information by masquerading as a trusty source.

New Email Scams Target Rotarians continued

•Several Rotarians have reported receiving a fraudulent email which reports to be from an Australian Rotarian stuck in London, England. The email claims the individual was robbed at gunpoint while on holiday and that she needs money to get home. Other Rotarians have reported receiving a similar email sent out in the name of a senior Rotary leader, a trustee of The Rotary Foundation, seeking money. The email claims that the individual is stuck at an airport with lost luggage and needs the cash to get home. Both emails are scams.

•An email scam with the subject line "Award Winning Notification Final" has targeted Rotarians claiming that they are one of 21 winners of a promotional program.

• An email scam targeting Rotarians and Rotaractors claims the recipient has won hundreds of thousands of Euros through an international promotional program conducted by the "Euro-Millones Lottery."

•An email scam with the subject line "Dear Award Beneficiary!!!" has targeted Rotarians claiming the recipient has won US\$500,000 and two HP laptops from RI.

RI encourages Rotarians and Rotary clubs to avoid becoming victims of such scams by deleting any email that appears suspicious.





Liability Insurance Program US Rotary Club & District

U.S. Rotary Clubs pay for insurance! What does this cover? On the 1 July Semiannual Report (SAR), each U.S. Rotary Club in our District pays for two different types of liability insurance:

- 1) general liability and
- 2) directors' and officers' / employment practices liability.

U.S. Rotarians are highly encouraged to visit the Insurance Information Portal to learn about their insurance coverage. This website has the certificate of insurance that U.S. clubs and districts can use as proof of insurance. Also, this site has useful information to help ensure safe and successful events and activities.

Please note that insurance claims are paid by from your assessments collected from US Rotarians. No doubt, there is incentive to make risk management and safety a priority. Visit the Insurance Information Portal for more information: www.locktonportal.com/sites/rotary/resources

Did You Know?

Youth Service: The Easton Rotary-sponsored children's ID program at the Miracle League was a big hit with the families. Child specific data including age, height, weight, physical or mental challenges, medical needs, and fingerprints were fed into a computer. Photographs were taken as well as voice recordings.

The information was then burned onto a CD which was presented to the parents. The CD can be given to the police if the child ever is missing. The police can then instantly transmit the information throughout their network in an effort to locate the missing child. CDs were made for 32 children.
