"I was the first president to have a Google Hangout and have done Facebook chats," Burton says, reflecting on his term, which ended at midnight 30 June. "But I asked Rotarians this year to Engage Rotary, Change Lives, so I needed to live that as well, by sitting at kitchen tables talking to families, visiting community

and register for these District events. I truly believe that the key to the success of Rotary and your clubs is Education. I have been stressing the need to educate our members and our communities as to what Rotary is and what Rotarians do.

As your District Governor, I am excited about the opportunity to begin the official District visits during which I share my goals and vision for our district this year. I have already completed one quarter of the visits and have been warmly received by those club members. projects, speaking to clubs, and meeting with other leaders around the world to promote Rotary's good work."

Burton, Rotary's 105th president, calls the job one of "awesome and great responsibility."

"It's a great honor to follow in the footsteps of [Rotary's founder] Paul Harris," says Burton, a member of the Rotary Club of Norman, Oklahoma, in the U.S. "When I travel around the world, I'm able to meet Rotarians from every walk of life and every culture. And all of them have such a deep respect for the office." He adds that it's been important to remember that "this position isn't about me. It's about the job."

The job of Rotary president essentially begins election to the position a year before taking office. Presidents-elect set an agenda for the coming year, pick committee chairs, and work on the convention program. All of that, Burton says, is to set the stage for a successful term. And looking back on the past two years, he's reminded of an adage from back home.

"There's a saying in Oklahoma that where you go in life, whatever job you set out to do, you should always leave the woodpile a little higher than it was when you found it," he says. "With the tremendous support of Rotarians worldwide, I believe we accomplished that this year."

A Visit from TRF

Jenna Archuleta, the Major Gifts Officer from The Rotary Foundation, PDG Roger Baumann, Chair of the District 7430 Endowment Committee, and PDG Mac Leask from CT and Endowment and Major Gifts Advisor for our Rotary Zone 32, visited in District 7430 starting on July 16th. There first stop was at the Doylestown RC regular meeting.

Jenna discussed the Rotary Foundation and all the good it does. As a Major Gifts Officer, she takes 10 trips a year to speak to people about the many things that the Foundation accomplishes and ways that Rotarians can support the Foundation.



Jenna gave a few examples of ways people have donated to the Rotary Foundation. One was a couple who gave a significant amount of money to provide a \$60,000 scholarship for a Rotary Peace Fellow every two years. Another example was a Rotary Peace Fellow who used his education working as an AIDs worker in Africa. Another example was Dr Robert Ali, a Rotarian and Ophthalmologist, who spends a lot of time traveling to developing countries providing free cataract surgery to

young people to give them the gift of sight. Dr. Ali decided to give \$250,000 to the Rotary Foundation when he retired using a major gift pledge payable over three years

Jenna also discussed the "Million Dollar Journey" starting now in our district. The district's goal is to raise a million dollars for the Rotary Foundation over the next 2 years. As part of that drive there will be a Million Dollar Dinner in May 2016 to recognize people who give or designate in their wills at least \$10,000 during this drive.



Jenna and Mac the next morning visited the Emmaus RC's regular meeting. Jenna gave a five minute review about this visit and what the Foundation is doing through District and Global Grants.

On Saturday morning there was a three hour meeting in Quakertown with D7430 Rotary Foundation committee chairs making plans for the next few years. In between these club visits the team met with individual Rotarians around the district.

Rotary Announces New Member Sponsor Recognition Program

Sponsor a new member and you'll not only strengthen your club, you'll also get recognized for your efforts. Through the New Member Sponsor Recognition program, sponsors will now receive a specially designed Rotary pin and recognition on Rotary's website.

Simply enter new members into your club's records <u>and identify</u> <u>the sponsor</u>. Each week, Rotary will send clubs a packet containing the names of newly identified sponsors along with Rotary pins and as many as four different-colored pin backers. The color of the backer depends on the number of new members sponsored, ranging from blue for one member to gold for six or more.

Keep track of the number of members you've sponsored by checking your My Rotary profile page. Gold-level sponsors will also be listed in the Membership Recognition Gallery, and if they attend the convention, invited to join the RI president for a special recognition event.

All new members and their sponsors must be designated in club records in My Rotary to participate in the program. Sponsors of members who joined Rotary on or after 1 July 2013 are eligible.

The displacement of more than 900,000 people from North



Waziristan in Pakistan's Federally Administered Tribal Areas (FATA) increases the risk that polio will spread, as the virus travels with people as they move out to other parts of the country. Due to a ban on polio vaccination since June 2012, the area has suffered 55 of the country's 94 cases in 2014. However, this displacement also creates an important opportunity. For the first time in more than two years, vaccinators can reach large numbers of children who could not previously get vaccine.

Between 21 May and 15 July, 406,051 doses of oral polio vaccine were administered at vaccination points set up along major transit routes on the way out of North Waziristan. Emergency vaccination campaigns have also been held in surrounding areas, including weekly activities in parts of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa and FATA. This week's campaign was reported to have reached almost 550,000 children.
