





Did You Know?

GET AN APP FOR YOUR SMART PHONE

Do you have a smartphone? If you do, did you know that you already have a full club directory in your pocket?

Club Runner (the computer software which we license for club administration) has a smart phone app for Apple and Android phones which lists our full club directory.

Now you can have the convenience of looking up contact information for anyone in the club in seconds. All you have to do is install the app on your phone and log in once. In order to login, in you will need a Club Runner ID and password.

If you have ever logged into the district website, it is the same ID and password. If you haven't, it is easy to set one up, just type <u>m.clubrunner.ca</u> into your mobile browser or <u>www.clubrunner.ca</u> on your computer. When it asks you to log in, at the bottom it will ask if you are a new or existing user needing to retrieve a log in.

When you click that link it will ask for your email, this is the email you use for Rotary correspondence; It will email you a temporary password to get started.

That's it. Once you log in you have full access to the online

directory by selecting "Members". Tapping the blue arrow will bring you the full profile for that individual.

At the first of this school year last November Fifteen students from the Interact Club at Parkland High School helped fill snack packs, working side-by-side with nine members of the Rotary Club of Allentown West. The **packs' non**-perishable food items, such as cereal, one-dish meals, fruit and healthy snacks



are given to economically disadvantaged students in the

elementary and middle schools."

I believe that many new people in one induction is a first for the club in its nearly 100 year history. We want to congratulate all the new members and all the sponsors who helped make it happen.









Campaign to end polio tackles the Ebola virus PolioPlus generating other major health benefits


Through our investments in the polio eradication infrastructure in Nigeria, the government was able to help stop the outbreak of Ebola. The polio surveillance network, which monitors cases of polio, is being employed to identify and track **suspected Ebola cases, contributing to Nigeria's successful response. Nigeria is still** one of three countries where polio is endemic, so it is vital that we continue our eradication efforts to prevent new outbreaks

Miles to end polio: \$6 million crosses the finish line for polio eradication

Rotary General Secretary John Hewko and six RI staff members bicycled 104 miles in Tucson Arizona, USA, on Saturday, for the Miles to End Polio event, raising more than \$6 million for polio eradication.

The money raised by Rotary will receive a two-to-one match from the Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation.

In addition to the team from Evanston, 100 Rotary member riders took part in the ride. The fundraising ride is part of the annual EI Tour de Tucson bike event in Tucson, Arizona



Endowment Fund.

During calendar year 2014, with the tremendous support of Rotarians and friends of Rotary, we received the \$70 million 2-to-1 match from the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation by meeting our obligation to commit \$35 million from the PolioPlus Fund toward the Global Polio Eradication Initiative.

Rotary's new grant model finished its first year of global support for projects in our six areas of focus, with district and global grant awards totaling \$70.8 million.



Your Foundation Update continued

Where Does the Money Go?

Here is a quick summary of the good work just two (There are others!) D7430 Rotary Clubs could make possible by drawing on resources from OUR Rotary Foundation:

Bethlehem Club worked with the Pune Pride Club to establish a Human Milk Bank in a neo-natal intensive care unit (NICU) at a hospital in Pune, Maharashtra State, India. \$8,000 from District 7430 grew to a \$45,000 project thanks to support from other Districts, Clubs and \$21,000 matching funds from OUR Rotary Foundation. The Milk Bank began operation in August 2014. (At the same time the Bethlehem Club used a District Grant to provide training by a lactation specialist in its own community. Yes, OUR Foundation supports projects right here!)

Morrisville-Yardley Club worked with the Lima Sunrise Club to provide ceramic water filters to 1200 homes in shanty towns surrounding Lima, Peru. \$18,500 from District 7430 grew to a \$39,550 project thanks to support from the Peru District, the Lima Sunrise Club and \$19,750 matching funds from OUR Rotary Foundation. The filters are made locally in Peru and each is expected to provide clean water to a family of 5 for 3 years. Doylestown, Bethlehem Morning Star, Ambler and Newtown joined the effort by replenishing the Annual Fund along with Morristown-Yardley, to be sure there will be more funds for other projects from other 7430 Clubs in the future!



Light Up Rotary Through Education

The facts are in. The more Rotarians know about Rotary, the longer they will stay a part of Rotary. There are many opportunities to learn, including multi-district group training, individual RC orientation meetings, rotary.org and D7430 and RC websites. Webinars and other on-line training courses.

What Others are Doing:

Supporting Education

Tablet technology brings the world to students in Fiji Rotary members and the Auckland University of Technology in New Zealand started an e-learning project in Fiji, donating 70 computer tablets to two schools. The Rotary grant-funded effort was cosponsored by the Rotary Clubs of Taveuni Island, Fiji, and Newmarket, New Zealand.

Kelsi Cox, a Rotary Scholar at the University of Auckland, helped deliver the tablets and train students to use them to learn science and math, and take photos and videos.

"We could bring a library of books to a school," says Cox, program coordinator for the Digital Learning Room, a project that advances **technology in schools in the South Pacific. "Or, we could bring this** tablet technology that is small but holds a world of information that

can take people to places far beyond the classroom."

Encouraging children in Brazil to read When Rotary members in District 4420 (part of São Paulo, Brazil) learned area literacy rates had fallen to 50 percent from 55 percent in four years, they took action. Twelve clubs teamed up to launch Project READ, building 13 reading centers in hospitals, meeting places, and other public facilities in poor communities.

With the help of a Rotary district grant, the project equipped each center with books and toys that encourage reading among children ages five to 12. A local monitor supervises each reading room and tutors students.







Ron was a member of Assumption BVM Catholic Church , Slatington, and currently held the position as vice president of the Holy Name Society. He also was a member of the American Legion Post 16, Slatington, the Slatington Moose, and the Emerald Fire Co.

He was born in Allentown and was a graduate of Northwestern Lehigh High School and Muhlenberg College.


