The Changeover program began with the 2009-10 District Governor, Mike McCarthy, reviewing the accomplishments of the prior twelve months. Then PDG Yvette, Palmer, Bill's wife, performed a brief induction ceremony to make the transfer of district leadership official.

Bill explained that there are 48 Rotary clubs located in District 7430 with nine areas each with its own Assistant Governor. In a typical year the 2,100 Rotarians of the district raise over \$800,000 and return them to their communities

along with more than 14,000 "people-hours" of labor doing service projects.

DG Bill reviewed the Rotary theme for 2010-11 "Building Communities, Bridging Continents" and the areas of emphases for Rotarians to pursue. Bill also explained his personal theme for our district "Rotary is Magic." Most of what Rotarians do every day around the world can be seen as service magic. He encourages all Rotarians to make their clubs Bigger, Better and Bolder this Magical Rotary year.

Rotarian Vernon Fenstermaker Honored

Long-time Rotary member, Vernon Fenstermaker, was honored on two very special occasions by the Rotary Club of Allentown West-Western Lehigh County by having a "Vernon Fenstrmaker Day" on January 27th of this year in honor of his 90th birthday. With family members in attendance, many Rotarians spoke about Vernon's accomplishments both in Rotary as well as in the community, for his country, and in his church.

While arranging the "Vernon Fenstermaker Day,"

his fellow Rotarians also wanted to do something even more to recognize Vernon's good deeds. The idea of erecting a flagpole with lighting next to the Veteran's Monument at Ziegels Church in Breinigsville, PA was conceived. Rotarians gave generously as

Vernon's role and duties as Secretary of our Club had touched many over the years, and within two weeks the money was raised. Work began on the flagpole in May of 2010 and by late June, the project was completed.

Sunday, July 11th was the day of dedication of the flagpole and lighting at Ziegels Church in recognition of Vernon. The service and celebration was attended by more than one hundred Rotarians, Church members, and community friends.

Vernon's relationship with Rotary began in 1967, while working at Lehigh Valley Dairy. The Company had a policy that management staff needed to be in a community or service organization. Vernon joined the Whitehall Rotary Club as a

Charter member in 1967 and in April of 1980 moved to the Rotary Club of Allentown West. Vernon served as Club Secretary for 15 years, stepping down only two years ago. Vernon is a Paul Harris Fellow and in 2003 reached major donor status. He is also a member of Rotary International's Bequest Society.

Vernon is an Army Veteran, serving as Staff Sergeant in the 9th Division from 1942 to 1945. He received four Battle starts for serving

> four theatres, and the Bronze Star for meritorious service.

Vernon is a life-long member of Ziegels United Church of Christ in Breinigsville. He served for many years on the church consistory as a Deacon and Elder. He also served on and chaired many

committees over the years.

as a Consultant to the Company.

Vernon was employed by Lehigh Valley Dairy beginning there in 1940. He returned there after World War II. He started as a store delivery route salesman, was promoted to Supervisor in 1950, Wholesale Manager in 1960, and Vice-President in 1980. After retirement in his early 70's, he continued to work part time
