Governor Bill's Thoughts

My fellow Rotarians, it is hard to believe that one year has come and gone. Karen and my lives have been blessed with all the friends we have made and the wonderful Rotary events we have attended. The one thing that has been confirmed many times over is Rotary's success in District 7430 is based upon the dedicated people in our 49 clubs. It is your energy and dedication that makes the great things happen in our local and global communities.

Before I finish let me once more make a personal appeal to everyone in the District – please contribute to the Rotary Foundation. As you are well aware, this year we received fifty percent of the funds donated to the annual fund in 2008-09 of which we were restricted to twenty percent for in-District projects (DSGs). In 2014-15 (Gary Fedorcha's year) this restriction will no longer apply and the District will be able to utilize the entire amount of the District Designated funds (DDF) in whatever manner they chose. I suspect there will be more funding for allocated District Simplified grants. What does that mean in real terms? Currently the District has contributed \$139,237 which means we would receive \$69,618 in DDF – not much if we want more funding for local projects. Will you join me and making this number a nice even \$100,000? All it will take in for ALL of our 1950 Rotarians to contribute an addition \$30 dollars to the Rotary Foundation. Please make this happen in order to bring more funding to our communities.

May has been a month of high activity for the District. Our many thanks to Cindy Hornaman and Loretta Ottinger for the super effort they gave to make the GSE Team from D-2550 Tonchi, Japan feel welcome. Karen and I attended the farewell picnic and we can attest that all of the team's initial requests, including visits to our two nuclear power facilities, were met. We will now share Rtn. Bruce Dernley and his team's excitement as they prepare to depart for Japan on June 9th.

We would like to again thank our youth Exchange Committee for making our year's inbound students have this once in a life time experience. Again, I have had the pleasure of joining these bright young people on several activities and can attest the future is not bleak as these students will take their Rotary Exchange experience and use it as one of the foundation stones to build their lives upon.

Speaking of youth, we look forward to a full complement of budding leaders attending the June 15-18 Camp Neidig. Please come out and congratulate your sponsored teens and register for the final BBQ dinner at Camp Neidig, Monday June 18th. Our work with our young people-Camp Neidig, Youth Exchange, Rotaract, Interact and the 4-Way Speech contest - has grown this year. 
