Council Approves Changes

Representatives from Rotary's 532 districts met in downtown Chicago 21-26 April, approving a number of measures designed to strengthen Rotary, increase membership, and enhance the organization's capacity to serve.

The Council on Legislation this year accepted an increase of \$1 per year in per capita dues, removed limits on e-clubs, permitted satellite clubs, and changed the name of the fifth Avenue of Service to "Youth Service."

Historic Moments: Women in Rotary

On May 4, 1987, the U.S. Supreme Court rules that Rotary clubs may not exclude women from membership on the basis of gender. Rotary issues a policy statement that any Rotary club in the United States can admit qualified women into membership. The Board "encourages all clubs in the U.S. to give fair and equal consideration to candidates for membership without regard to gender."

1989

In 1989 at its first meeting after the 1987 U.S. Supreme Court decision, the Council on Legislation votes to eliminate the requirement in the RI Constitution that membership in Rotary clubs be limited to men. Women are welcomed into Rotary clubs around the world.

The vote followed the decades-long efforts of men and women from all over the Rotary world to allow for the admission of women into Rotary clubs, and several close votes at previous Council meetings.

The response to the decision was overwhelming: By 1990, the number of female Rotarians had skyrocketed to over 20,000.

Women have served in leadership positions as high as the RI Board of Directors and The Rotary Foundation Board of Trustees.

Rotarians work together to restore sight to the blind in Ghana

Dr. Albert Alley, director of World Blindness Outreach, and six villagers who received free cataract surgery during the mission.

"Thank you, my friend." We heard and said these words many times on our recent medical mission to Apam, Ghana, 4-11 May. We heard them from the 87 patients who received cataract, pterygium, or glaucoma surgery, and from the patients' family members, hospital personnel and administrators, and village elders.

The goal of the mission was "to treat preventable and correctable blindness and eye disease." Rotarians from District 9100 (Ghana) and <u>7390 (Pennsylvania</u>, USA) spent 11 months organizing the trip in partnership with World Blindness Outreach. The medical mission involved two Rotary districts and five Rotary clubs.
