Central Bucks RC Leads with its Rotabuild Program

Betty Nemeth's wish for a Handicapped Ramp was Granted on September 22nd by Twilight Wish Foundation and by the Central Bucks Rotary Rotabuild Program. Nemeth, 71, relies on a wheelchair due to her medical condition and it is a struggle to get in and out of her Morrisville home. Wehrung's Lumber & Home Center in Ottsville, Pa., also partnered with the organizations to supply materials for the project.



The Central Bucks Rotary Club is helping local Bucks County residents improve their quality of life. Under their newly launched Rotabuild Program, Rotarians perform in-home projects that address accessibility & life safety issues. This service is for individuals and families who are financially unable to complete such projects on their own.

Rotabuild projects for the elderly, veterans and handicapped people include replacing door latches for easier access, installing grab bars for independence in the bathroom, and installing wheelchair accessible ramps. 




District Committee Reports

Foundation:

The Sept. 29th Foundation Grant Model Seminar in KOP went very well; see separate article herein. The Oct 21st Major Donor Event had 32 people gathered at PDG Roger Whitcomb's house to thank them for their support of the Rotary Foundation.

We have received 14 District Simplified Grant applications and have just enough money to fund those that qualify. Global/ Matching Grants have two more requests going to TRF soon, to join the approved Morrisville-Yardley project for bio-sand filters in Peru, and the pending request from North Penn for literacy education in Zimbabwe.

As of Oct 25th APF donations are at \$32,900, and Polio Plus has received \$18,000. Harleysville RC now shows 100% participation for EREY purposes. The District Golf Tournament raised just shy of \$15,000 for the Rotary Foundation.





IT'S FEDERAL TAX TIME FOR RCs

The IRS has declared that RI and its clubs and districts are entitled to exemption from federal income tax under Section 501(c)(4) of the Internal Revenue Code. While entitled to this exemption under RI's group exemption ruling, the law does require that all Rotary clubs in the U.S. and its territories file an annual information return <u>by 15</u> November.

The form a club must file is dependent upon its gross receipts for the year. For more information, please see: <u>Form 990 Series – Which</u> Forms do Exempt Organizations File? at www.irs.gov.

It is imperative that your club comply with IRS requirements. Please note that Section 6033(j) of the Internal Revenue Code automatically revokes the exemption of any organization that fails to satisfy its filing requirement for three consecutive years. 

D7430 (that's us) and D7450 to our south joined forces and conducted our annual Rotary Foundation Seminar at the DoubleTree in King of Prussia on Saturday, September 29, 2012. Attendance was very good with over 70 Rotarians from our district on hand for the great presentations and meetings.

The Keynote speaker for the opening plenary was TRF Trustee Stephanie Urchick. Using a series of creative head wear, she told marvelous stories about what Rotarians are doing all over the world to help people.



During the noontime plenary the featured speaker was Charlie Lyddane, a Rotarian just returned from a National Immunization Day (NID) in Pakistan. His experiences giving the life-saving drops to prevent Polio were heartwarming to hear.


