Good Rotary Clubs need to have all members doing something in order to carry out the complex operations of leadership, membership, fellowship, youth service, vocational service, fundraising and ultimately the service projects in the community and in the world. Leadership from the president, treasurer, secretary, board members and committee chairs provides the coordination for the Club and its members. The essential tool for maintaining this coordination is communications.

Ask yourself, as a member of your Club, do you know what the Club Plan is for this year? What is your Membership Goal, and what is your responsibility in achieving that goal?

You can ask the same question for the Foundation Giving Goal, the Service Projects for the year and the Fundraising Activities to provide the funds for these projects. Does your Club sponsor an Interact Club, Rotaract Club, send high school students to Camp Neidig (RYLA), participate in the 4-Way Test Speech Contest, Youth Exchange Program or academic awards?

Does your annual budget address all of the Club's activities? When is your Club's next fellowship event? Do you know what and when are the next weekly program topics or speakers? When is the next committee meeting that, as a member, you are expected to attend and what is the agenda for that meeting? The list goes on and on. You can't answer these questions with out a good system of communications within your Club.

Rotary maintains the requirement of weekly meetings. When peoples who want to serve their community meet regularly and frequently, ideas are shared. Ideas lead to plans that lead to actions. Weekly meetings are necessary in order to address all the actions that can be generated by an efficient Rotary Club. The communications at these meetings and in between is the channel for action. And Communicating is every member's responsibility. How is your meeting time used?

Why should we ask ourselves these questions? Because We Can..... and We Care.

RI's New Website Debuted August 26th

RI unveiled the new RI website on August 26th. It is important to remember that each Rotarian will have to re-register in order to gain access. Please ensure that all contact information for you, your Club leadership and the members are up-to-date with RI in order to avoid frustration when trying to register. There are two distinct versions of the website:

<u>1. My Rotary (for members)</u>

All members will be encouraged to register and sign in when visiting the site. Members will be able to better engage through their own customized experience based on their interests, and conduct their Rotary business more easily than ever before.

• The new website will eliminate the need for the Member Access Portal (MAP). Those currently registered in MAP will simply be prompted to re-register when first visiting the site and will then be able to access tools previously located in MAP, such as the ability to make district appointments, Rotary Club Central, etc.

2. Rotary.org (for the general public)

• The public site tells our story to external audiences in a fresh, streamlined way, encouraging people to get to know Rotary and learn about all the great work Rotarians are doing all over the world.

Find what you need!

• The website has been entirely rebuilt, grouping items more logically. Testing has confirmed that the user experience is cleaner and more streamlined than what is offered today. For example, tools that help you manage your Rotary business—such as membership and contribution reports—are now conveniently located under a tab called "Manage."

The website's "search" engine is now powered by Google, making locating documents, articles and tools much easier.

Important changes:

• "Contact this Club" – visitors to the site can submit a request online to learn more about a specific club and membership; the RI Board has requested that an email be automatically sent to the District Governor and Membership Chair to notify you of this request, so you can follow up as appropriate.

• Rotary Foundation Grants – many of you have already visited the Rotary Grants microsite and all it has to offer. That functionality will now be merged into the new site so everything you need will be in one place.

• As part of the new launch, we are also adopting industry leading security measures to manage your IDs and passwords. To facilitate this transition, any MAP user from the last year will go through an abbreviated re-registration process.

• The new website uses some of the latest browser capabilities and because of that, visitors to the site will need to be on modern browsers. Whatever browser you prefer to use, we recommend you upgrade to the latest version to have the best experience possible.

Allentown West Rotary pig roast fundraiser aids Engineers Without Borders work in Africa

The Allentown West Rotary Club recently sponsored a "pig roast" fundraiser at Ontelaunee Park, Lynn Township.

The club is involved with a new project working with Engineers Without Borders of the Lehigh Valley. "We are rebuilding the infrastructure", said Herb Klotz, a member of both Rotary and the Engineers. They travel to Mattru in Sierra Leone, an African country ravaged during the civil war in the 1990's.

Much of the work has been done at the Centennial School. And this is the third year the group has traveled to Africa twice a year for two week long trips.

The 2012 project had The Engineers partnering with Rotary to provide s new fresh water well. An earlier joint project furnished solar panels to provide electricity to some classrooms.

Rotary is working on one grant in support of the work and a second one will be used to refurbish three buildings, the chemistry and biology rooms and a dining hall, needing new roofs.

Klotz said students are at the school every night keeping up with their studies. A thousand students attend the school now that it is being restored.

A team has 15 members and the leader is Diana Dunn of Fogelsville.

Rotarian honored at Scout Jamboree



Steve Henning, Rockland Township, presented Silver Wheel for years of service in his own Hawk Mountain Council as well as in IFSR Exhibit booths and as IFSR Webmaster for half a decade



When the 36,000 Scouts and leaders recently returned home with many fond memories from the 10-day 2013 National Boy Scout Jamboree at the new Bechtel Summit Reserve in West Virginia. Steve Henning of Rockland Township returned with one unexpected fond memory. He was attending a Rotary Meeting at the Jamboree and the BSA's Chief Scout Executive, Wayne Brock, was the featured speaker.

At the conclusion of the meeting, Henning was surprised when he was called forward, and even more shocked to be presented the International Fellowship of Scouting Rotarians Silver Wheel Award, their highest award. IFSR International Commissioner, Brian Thiessen, presented the award,

"The Silver Wheel Award is for outstanding service to the International Fellowship of Scouting Rotarians over years of effort. Steve is not only active in IFSR within his home Hawk Mountain Council, but has served in IFSR exhibit booths at national and international Jamborees and Rotary conferences, is the author of the widely read and appreciated On My Honor ... The Hawk Mountain Council Story 1908-2010 hardbound book, is one of our nation's leading experts in rhododendrons and azaleas (so much so that his email tells it all (rhodyman@) and has also served as IFSR's Webmaster (http://www.ifsr-net.org) for more than half a decade.

IFSR salutes you, Steve, and thanks you for your tireless efforts on our behalf! You are indeed one of the Silver Wheels that makes IFSR roll smoothly!" Henning has been a member of the Boy Scouts for 48 years and a Rotarian for 23 years.

He heard about the IFSR while on staff at the World Scout Jamboree in Korea in 1991 with Brian Thiessen. His 48 years in Scouting included 13 years as a professional employee at Hawk Mountain Council. He retired in 2002 and has continued to be actively involved in Scouting.

"I found that Scouting and Rotary's common goal of service combined with Rotary's historic support of Scouting and other youth programs made the International Fellowship of Scouting Rotarians a great way to inspire other Rotarians to be more supportive of Scouting and other youth programs," Henning said. "And, by the way, Brian's comment about rhododendrons is because he and I also share an appreciation for rhododendrons and azaleas."

Prior to becoming a professional, Henning held numerous positions in Scouting. He served as a leader with a Whitfield Troop. He later became an organizer and recruiter for Tigers Cubs, the BSA's pre-Cub Scout program. He also worked to save Troops and Packs that were in jeopardy due to leadership and membership problems. While serving as a BSA professional, Henning served as a District Executive in Schuylkill County, was on staff at National and World Scout Jamborees, and served as adviser to the staffs for advanced adult leader and youth leader training. Since retiring, he has served on staff at Trail to Eagle Camp and continues to serve on staff at National and World Jamborees as well as on various Hawk Mountain Council committees.

In 2008, Henning was asked to write a book on the story of Hawk Mountain Council for the BSA's 100th Anniversary Celebration in 2010. "It was a lot of fun researching the history of Scouting and how it came from England to Berks and Schuylkill Counties, but the best part of writing the book was in interviewing over a 100 veteran Scout leaders and collecting thousands of photographs. Every photograph had a story to tell," Henning said.

As a Scouting Rotarian, he serves as the IFSR Webmaster, and sets up Scouting exhibits at Rotary Conferences and Rotary Exhibits at Boy Scout jamborees. He was president of the Mahanoy City Rotary Club and currently is Club Secretary of the Kutztown Rotary Club.

Henning noted, "the Boy Scouts justifiably received a lot of national publicity for having girls in Venturing, the BSA's co-ed older youth program, as participants at the 2013 National Jamboree, but the publicity was incorrect in stating this was the first BSA Jamboree where girls were allowed to be participants. When I was on staff at the 1989 National Jamboree at Fort. A.P. Hill, Virginia, we had a co-ed contingent of Explorers as participants including 22 girls. Some of the girls were Girl Scouts that enrolled in Exploring so they could attend the Jamboree. From then until this year, girls were allowed to serve on staff, but were not allowed to be participants."
