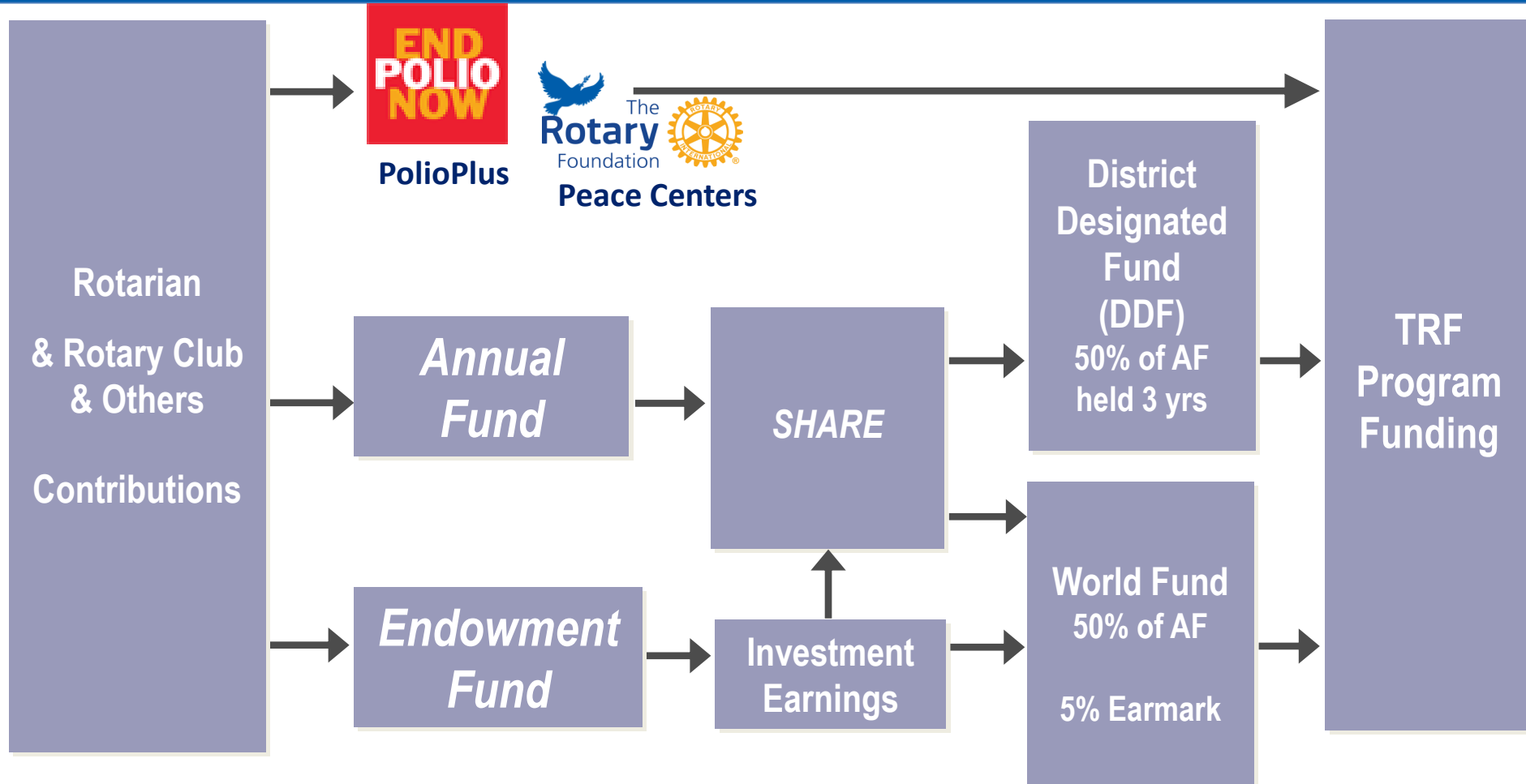

District Grants-Community & Club Impact

DISTRICT GRANTS

- Up to 50% of new DDF each year
- Educational and humanitarian
- Smaller activities and projects
 - Local grants
 - Exchanges/Missions/Scholarships
- Local or international activities at Club and/or District level
- Requests from Club(s), Rotaract, Interact, Committees
- Local decision making with broad guidelines
- Managed by District – Requires Club Qualification



DISTRICT GRANTS – OUR CLUBS

- Growth: 13 Projects, 13 Clubs, \$13,000 2004-05
33 Projects, 37 Clubs, \$85,000 2019-20
- Amount available depends on Annual Fund-SHARE support
- Community Development, Education, Food and Health
 - Leading areas for projects
- Community Impact/Club Impact – Examples:
 - Kutztown: The Potato Project
 - Hatboro: Harmony Theater Stage
 - Bethlehem: Human Trafficking Awareness
 - Quakertown: Men's Rehab Center Remodel
 - Upper Perkiomen: Counselling Center Refrigerator

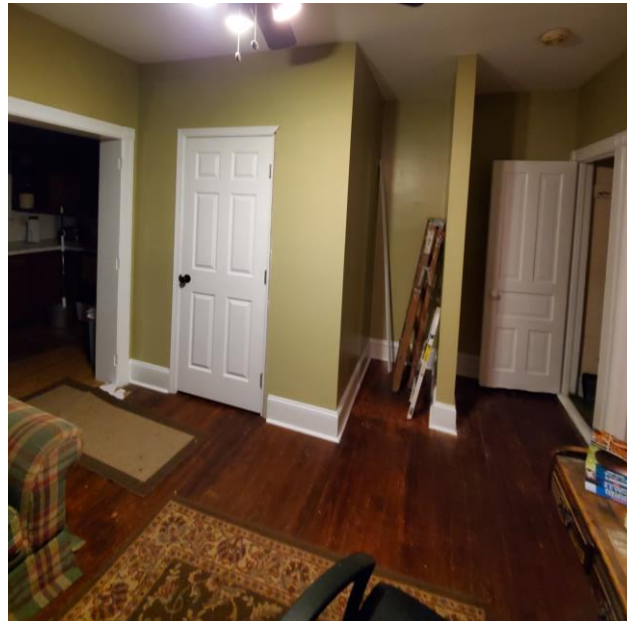

Global Grants-Community & Club Impact

GLOBAL GRANTS

- Larger grant awards, \geq \$30,000 total budget
- **International Partner** Club
- **Matched** with \$\$ from World Fund (\$15K or more)
- **Sustainable** outcomes
- Alignment with **Areas of Focus**
- **Long-term** projects – May be done here!
- Community **needs assessment**
- Managed by the Rotary Foundation
- Apply My Rotary/Grant Center–Ask DRFC/DGSC Chair



GLOBAL GRANTS – OUR CLUBS

- History: Some 150 grant projects around the world, 13 open 33 Clubs, \$4.25 million total, \$2.5 million TRF
- Amount available depends on Annual Fund-SHARE support
- Health, Water, Education and Community Development
 - Leading areas for projects
- Community Impact/Club Impact – Examples:
 - Harleysville: Otampo Water Project, Follow-ons
 - Allentown West: Centennial School, Ripples
 - Blue Bell: Mama Natalies Training, Path

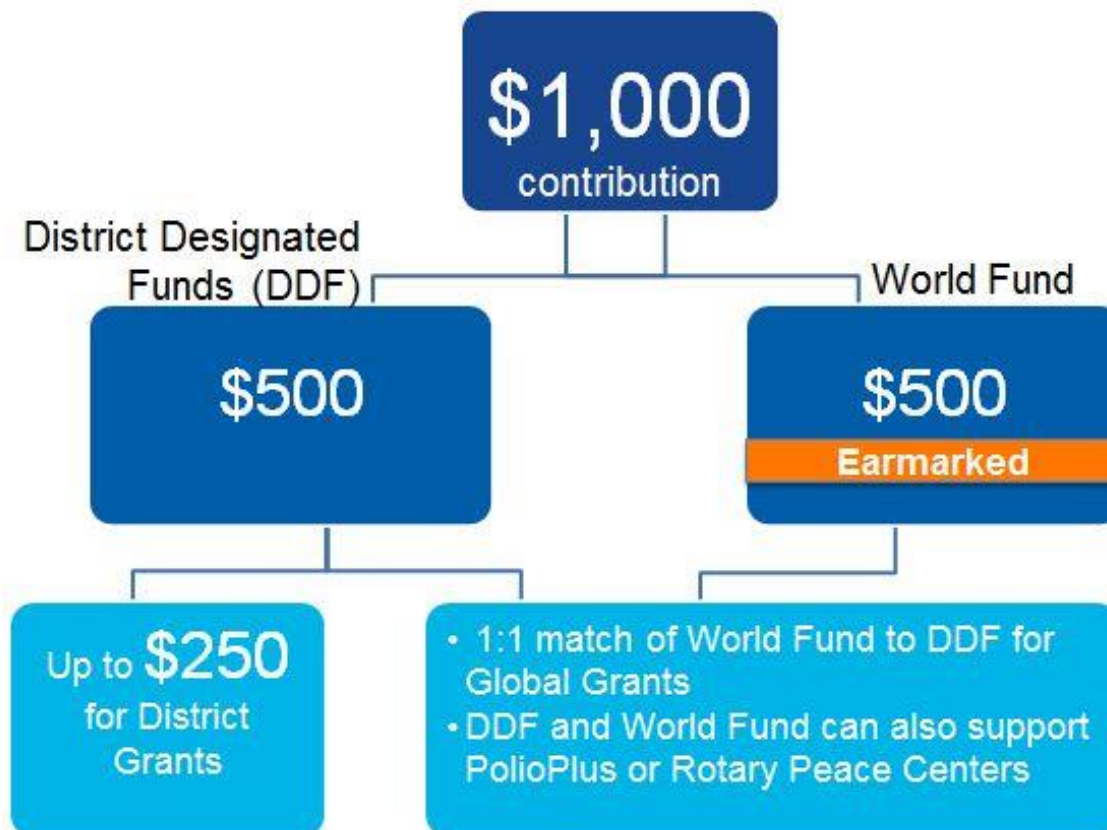

SHARE SYSTEM - EXAMPLE



- Note this does not include DDF generated by Endowment Fund-SHARE spendable earnings.
- Unused DDF will roll forward.
- 5% of the contribution is earmarked to cover operating expenses if investment earnings are insufficient.
