






Biddeford-Saco

This house had been foreclosed on by the City of Biddeford for unpaid taxes. The City contacted the Biddeford Saco Rotary Club and asked us if we would be interested in another joint venture with the students enrolled in the Center of Technology. This gives the students an opportunity to put their classroom skills to work in an actual building. This includes carpentry, plumbing, electrical, excavation, roofing, siding, sheetrock, installation of doors and windows. Every aspect of construction from the ground up to handing the keys over to the new owner. The Club's work team was visited by DG Peggy during the Open House. The house is under contract and was expected to close mid March.

Sebago Lake


The Sebago Lake Rotary Club sponsored its 20th Annual Ice Fishing Derby on Feb 20-21 with outstanding results. Over 1,000 registrants brought in over 2500 fish which were processed by Nova Seafood in Portland, flash frozen and delivered to food pantries in the area which will provide approx. 3,000 meals.

The derby was first created to help the Inland Fisheries and Wildlife with their fish management by removing the invasive species of togue (Lake Trout) and Pike from Sebago Lake. It now includes all of Cumberland County and more species of fish for prizes such as Perch and Pickerel as well as Togue and Pike.

This year's new Gold Sponsor was General Dynamics/Bath Iron Works which provided the cash fish pool prizes.

There were 3 winners in each category, togue, pike, perch and pickerel. Pictured is 1st – for togue at 10.78 lb/32", Greg MacIntosh.






Portland


