


Dover

Ogunquit and Wells Rotary Clubs Partner to Thank Frontline Workers



A local attorney, Flagg thought it would be fun to raise a few bucks, not thinking it would amount to much. But what started as a joke, ended up raising \$7,500. With approval of the Rotary BOD, the monies were then gifted to Red's Good Vibes of Greenland, NH.


Red's Good Vibes was founded in 2020 when schools closed and family's were hurting, due to the pandemic. Three siblings focused their efforts to provide groceries, warm clothing and toiletries to those in need. Also serving hot meals, from their food truck. The 3 siblings, Caitlin, Meghan and Michael were inspired by memories of their late brother Robert "Red" McGrath. Red who died in 2017 always wanted a truck that could help those struggling financially. For over a year, as a non-profit organization, with a warehouse in Greenland, Red's Good Vibes has delivered groceries to between 80 and 100 households a week, within 30 miles of Portsmouth. Delicious free meals are served from the bright red truck. Red's Good Vibes is a mobile giving organization. It is there mission to provide support and relief to the community with a smile and no judgement. President Jon delivered the \$7500 check to Caitlin McGrath-Levesque who called it a "game changer" for their organization.


South Portland Cape Elizabeth
