# District Foundation Committee Bimonthly Report - October 11, 2016

#### **Grants:**

Global Grant 1635028 to provide literacy training for Syrian refugees residing in Jordan was approved by TRF. Total grant is valued at \$186,501 including \$36,000 from five D-7780 clubs and \$20,000 in District 7780 DDF. International lead club is Biddeford-Saco, and Roland Gagne is chairing the effort.

Global Grant 1637992, a follow-on grant to support the Healthy Kids/Brighter Future initiative in Zambia, was also approved by TRF and has been partially paid. This \$122,332 grant was initiated by D-7930 and includes \$11,000 in cash from nine D-7780 clubs plus \$10,000 in District 7780 DDF.

\$35,032 in District Grant funds have been delivered to the 13 clubs that were awarded these grants. Meanwhile, 2015-16 District Grants are being closed out.

#### **Anniversaries:**

October is Polio month; chair Lawrence Furbish is promoting all clubs to do something locally to mark the day.

November is Foundation month. Our big celebration is the 100-for-100 event, chaired by Ann Lee Hussey. We are very fortunate that President-nominee Sam Owori will be headlining the event, to which all Rotarians are invited and encouraged to attend. Registration is open on the District website.
