
Dover

Portland

Portland Rotary to Dedicate Memorial Bench to Loretta Rowe

Loretta Rowe was the one of the first women to join the Rotary Club of Portland, Maine becoming a member in 1988. She was an exemplary Rotarian who lived the Rotary motto of "Service Above Self." She served as the first woman President of the Portland Rotary Club during the 1998-1999 Rotary year. Loretta later served as an Assistant District Governor for Rotary District 7780, and she was recognized as a Paul Harris Fellow on multiple occasions. She also served as Club Secretary for the Portland Rotary Club for several years. Loretta was an energetic, engaged and enthusiastic member of Rotary who was loved and respected by all members of her Rotary family. Sadly, she died on September 24, 2020, after a 4-year challenge with cancer. She was 75 years old. Portland Rotarians generously contributed memorial donations to remember and recognize Loretta's service. The donations will purchase a granite memorial bench engraved to honor Loretta's service to Rotary. Portland Rotary President Ellen Niewoehner announced that the memorial bench will be located in Rotary Cove, a small park located near the Ferry Terminal and overlooking Casco Bay, in Portland. 


