Build your Club Pyramid!

The District Governor's challenge this year is to build a Pyramid of Peace, between July 1, 2017 and April 15, 2018. Recognition will take place at the 2018 Rotary Mount Washington Summit (our multi-district conference) the weekend of May 4, 2018.

To be eligible:

Your club should enter goals for at least six "Pyramid of Peace" service initiatives, one for each area of focus, into Rotary Club Central. Mark the project with the (PoP) designation at the end of the title: for example, "Preschool Book Drive (PoP)".

To achieve the award:

Accomplish six of your Pyramid of Peace goals, one for each area of focus, before April 15, 2018, and report the achievement in Rotary Club Central by that date.

Goals may be simple – or you may get creative! For instance, a local PolioPlus fundraiser qualifies for the fighting-disease goal, and growing your ongoing community literacy effort would satisfy the education goal. You could support a neighboring club's water filtration project in Haiti. Your Assistant Governor can share more examples.

These may be new or continuing projects. They should be entered with volunteer hour and dollar goals, along with estimates of actual volunteer hours and dollars raised when the project is marked "achieved" before April 15, 2018.

To build your Pyramid of Peace:

Set the six goals, and engage your club in at least one activity in your local community, or internationally, that falls within **each** of the six Rotary Areas of Focus.

- Promoting Peace
- Supporting Education and Literacy
- Growing Local Economies
- Fighting Disease
- Providing Clean Water
- Saving Mothers and Children

These initiatives may be undertaken with partner Clubs, or with non-Rotary organizations as long as your Rotary Club takes the lead. Your work will showcase, to your local community, the six areas that Rotary focuses upon, around the world and right here at home.

Your Pyramid of Peace award will be presented with special district and worldwide distinction if your club also earns the Presidential Theme and Citation Award from Rotary International President Ian Riseley.
