



ANNUAL GIVING BASICS MARIANNE PINKHAM, ANNUAL FUND CHAIR

Annual Fund-SHARE is the primary source of funding for Rotary grants, as well as a broad range of local and international Rotary Foundation activities. Rotarians know that their Foundation is supported not by club dues, but by *voluntary donations from individual Rotarians* and friends of The Rotary Foundation.

Every Rotarian, Every Year (EREY), which is usually referred to by its nickname - "E-RAY" - is the fundraising initiative designed to encourage Rotarian's support for their Foundation's Annual Fund.

Through the SHARE system, contributions to The Rotary Foundation are transformed into project grants and programs.




Note: 'EREY Members' reflect the number of donors who contributed some amount to the Annual Fund during the Rotary Year, 'Sustaining Members' reflect the number of donors who contributed US\$100 or more to the Annual Fund. 'PHS Eigheir effect the number of donors who contributed US\$1,000 or more to the Annual Fund, Polio Plus or approved Foundation Grant.

ANNUAL FUND – SHARE EVERY ROTARIAN, EVERY YEAR

Between now and June 30, 2021, if the 867 District 7780 Rotarians who are waiting to make their 2021 contribution to the Rotary Foundation give at least \$25 to the Annual Fund (\$21,625), the possibilities of what District 7780 could accomplish would multiply.

District 7780 In 2019-20:

- \$231,920 given to the Annual Fund SHARE.
- 44% of District Rotarians made an EREY donation.
- \$49,071 awarded in District grants to 11 clubs.
- \$25,00 Rotary Disaster Response COVID Grant awarded and divided equally between all 41 clubs (\$609.76) for food security.
- \$131,689 available as a District Designated Fund (DDF) credit to match Global Grants

- 4. Set an ANNUAL GIVING goal for the Club
- 5. Set a POLIOPLUS goal for the Club
- 6. Enter the two numbers into Rotary Club Central (your assistant governor can help you!






Club Dashboard-Goal Center This year (2020-2021)
