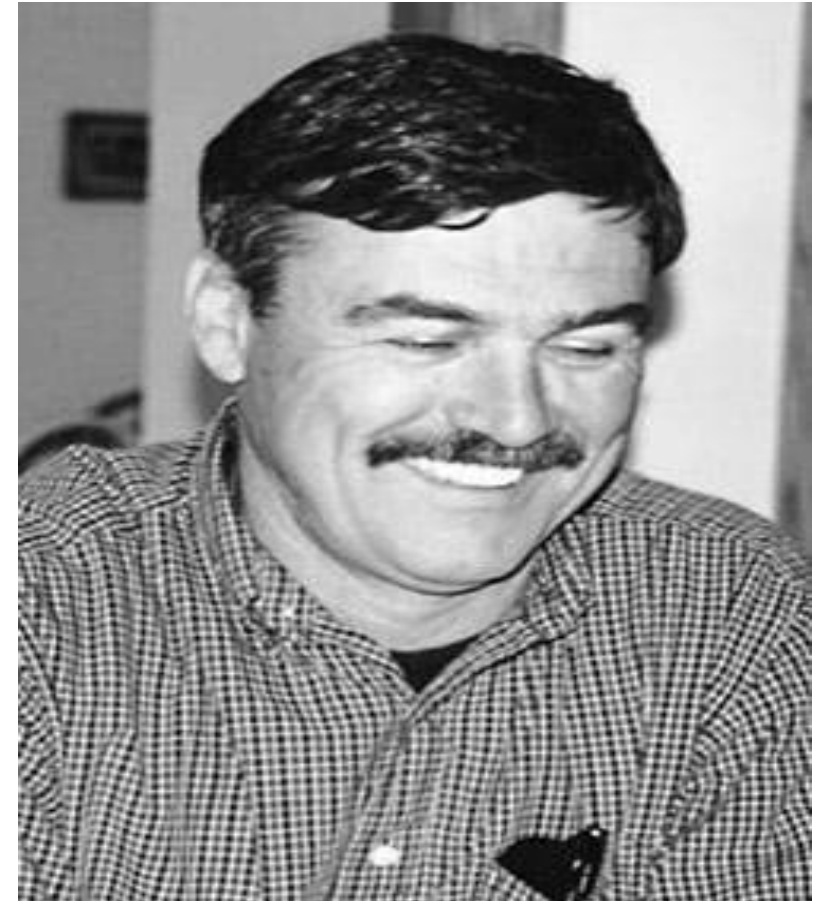


# Kenneth Paul Toner

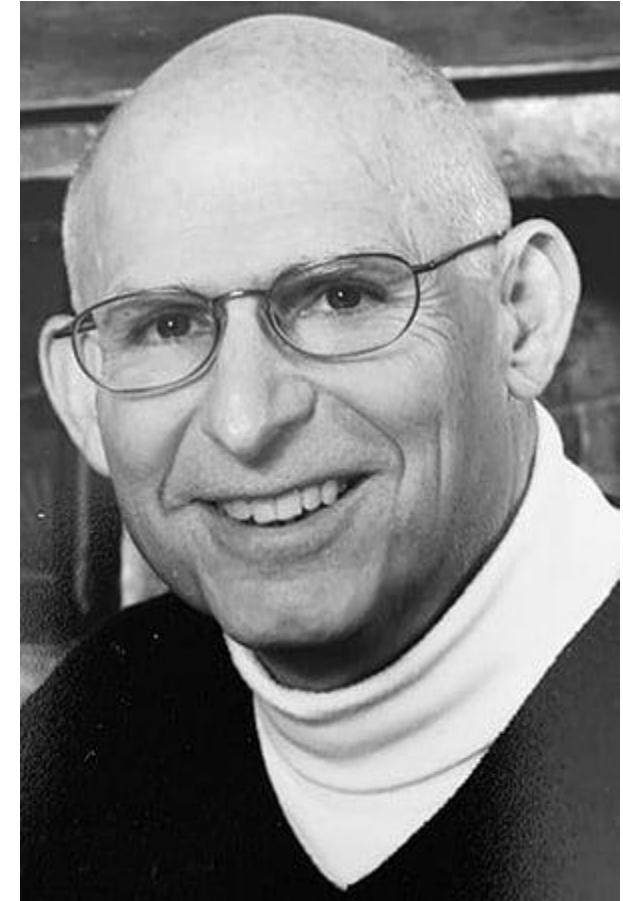

- He is survived by his wife, 1 son, and a brother



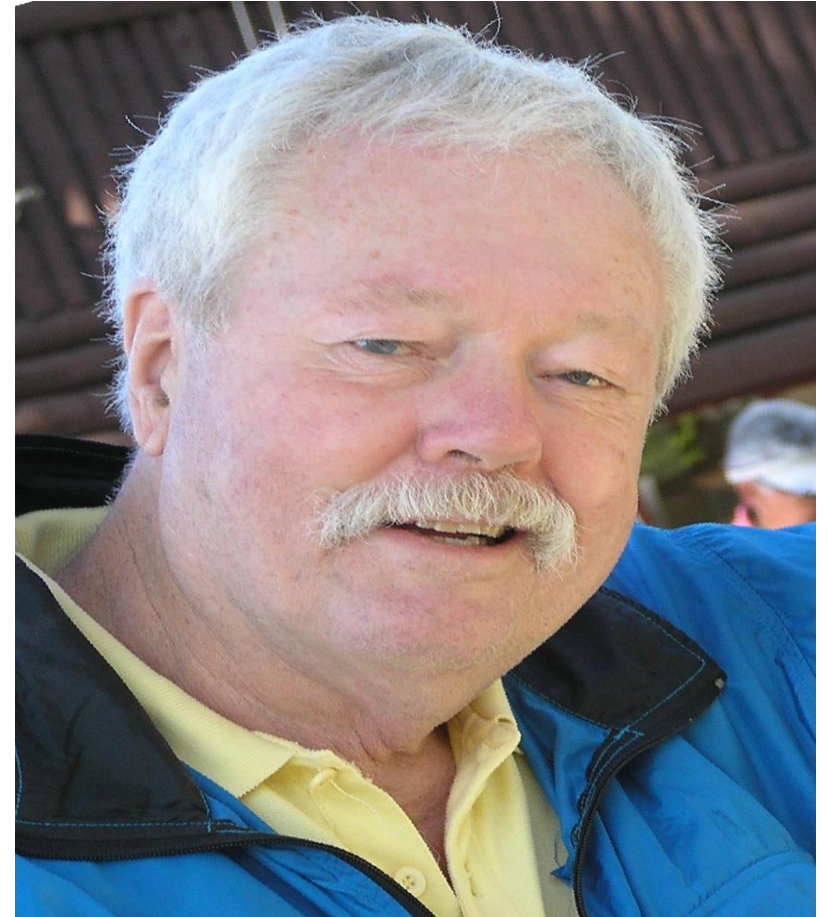
