1929-2021

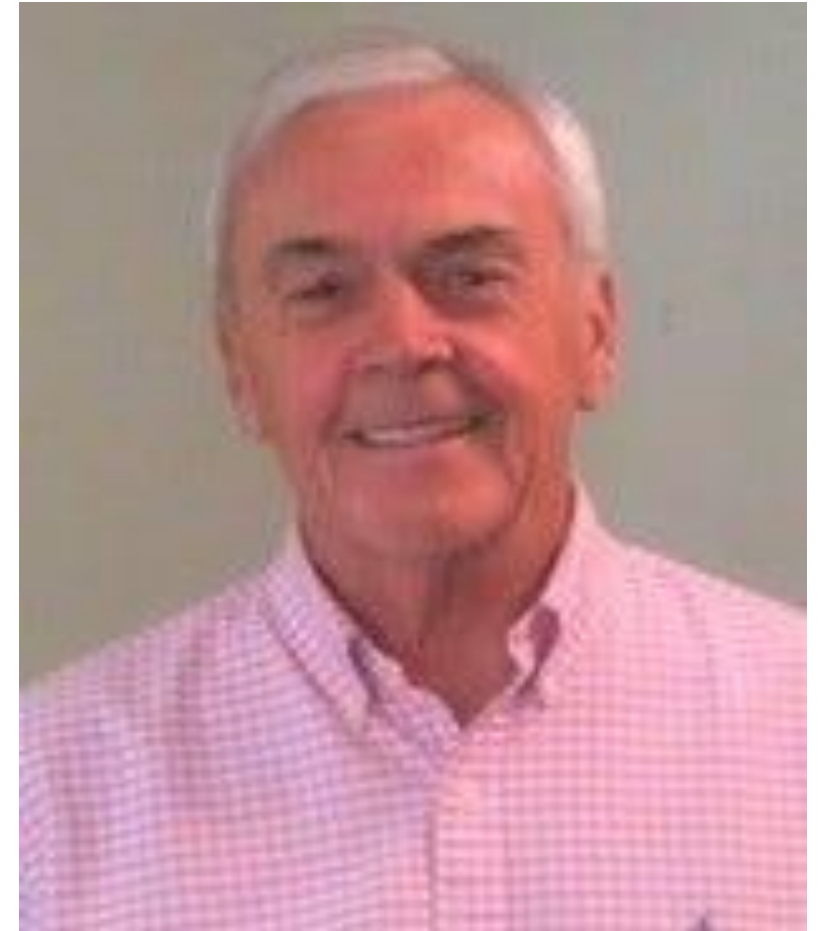
- Rotary Club of Portland, Maine

1955-2022

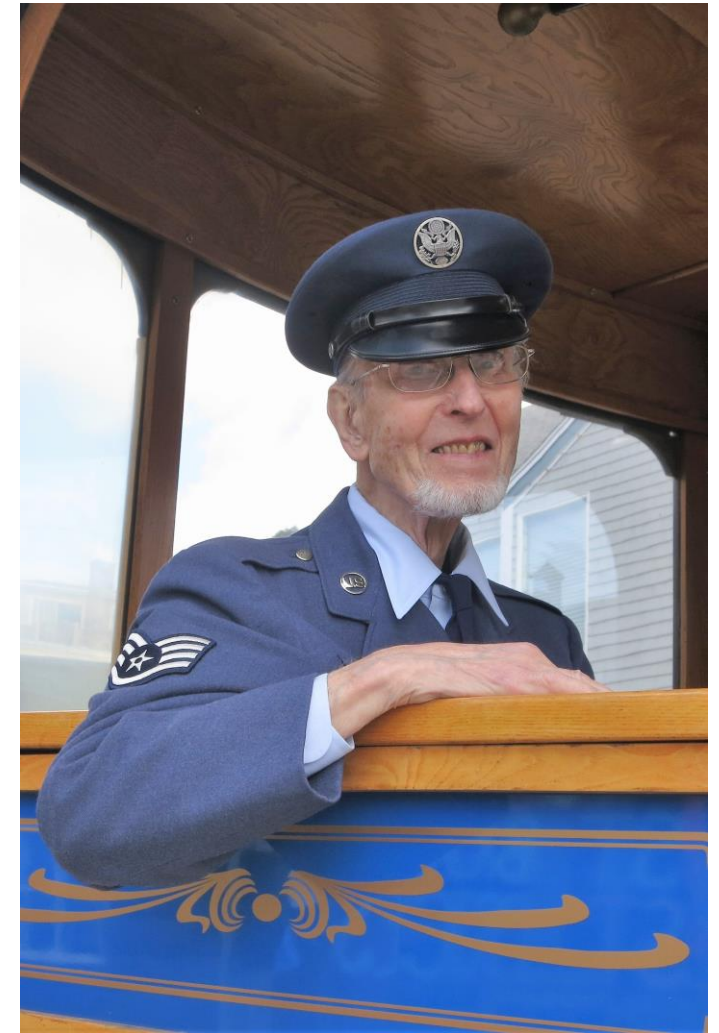
- **Rotary Club of Portland**

1950-2022

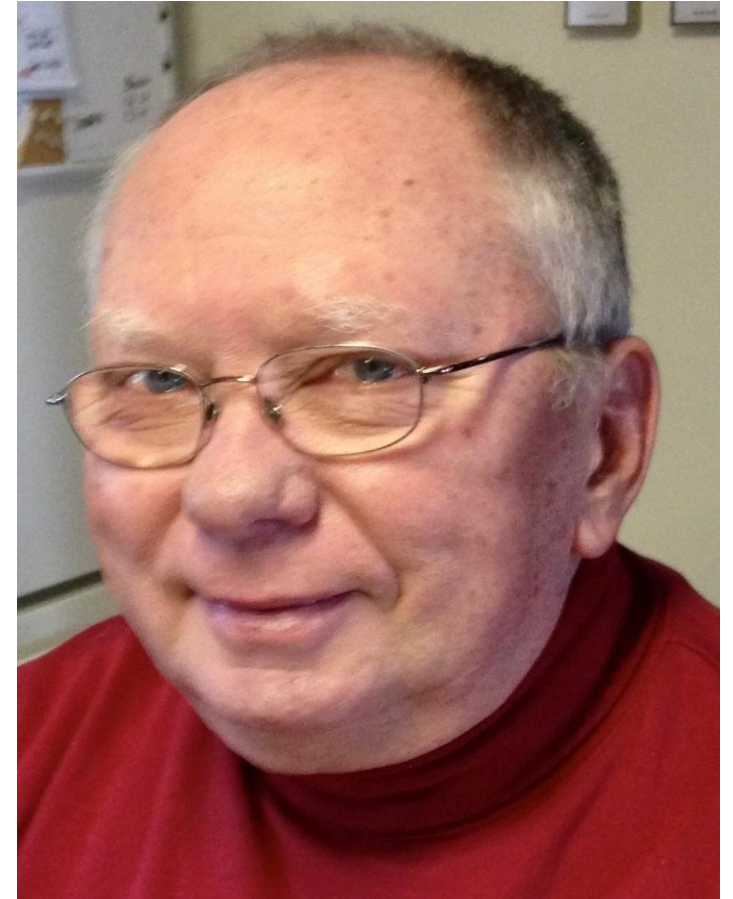
- Rotary Club of York, ME

1942 - 2022

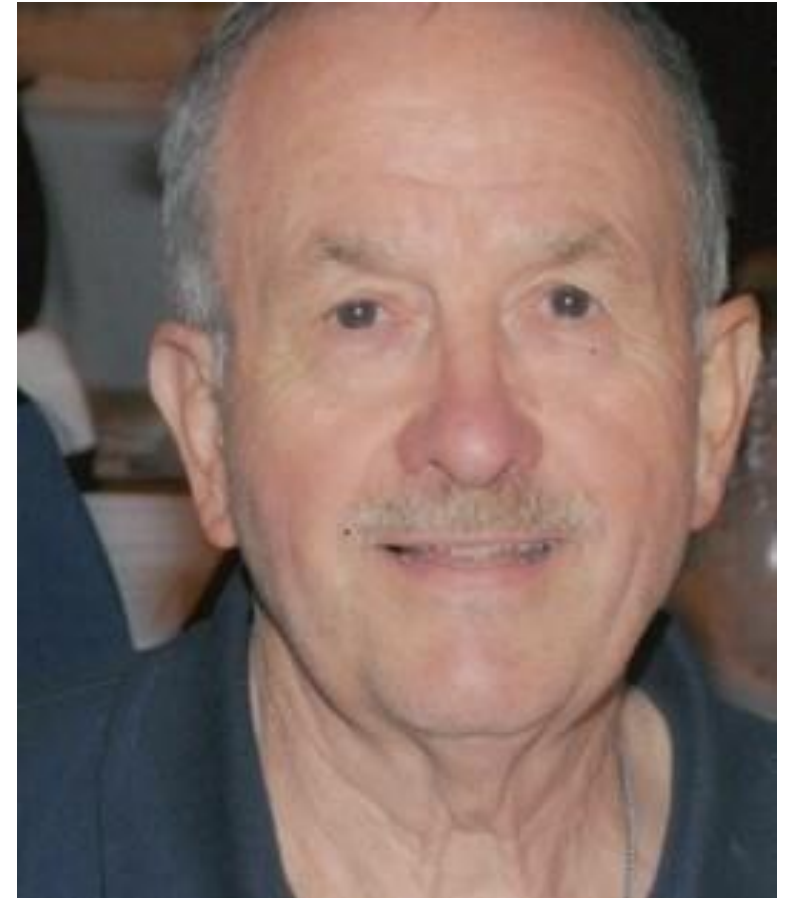
- Rotary Club of Biddeford-Saco, ME in 1971

1945-2022

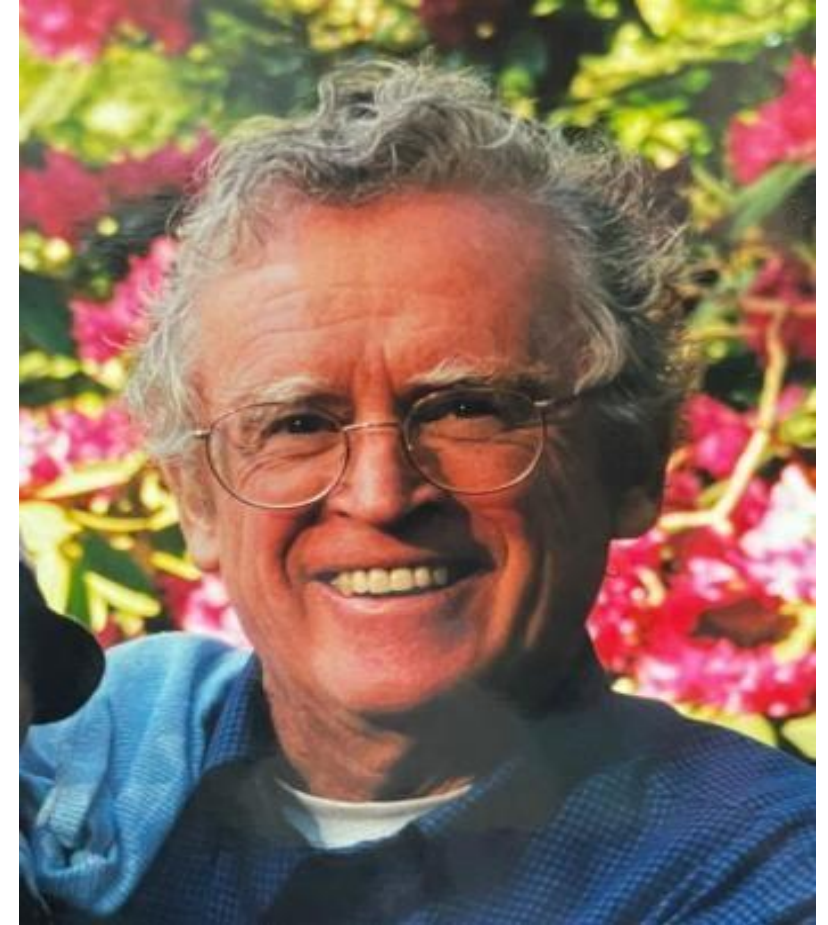
- **Rotary Club of Boothbay Harbor - Club President in 2012-2013**

Her last act was raising funds for Village Health Works of Burundi for a water system & ambulance for the hospital in Kirungu.
- She is survived by 2 sons, 1 daughter & 7 grandchildren.

David B. Dearborn II

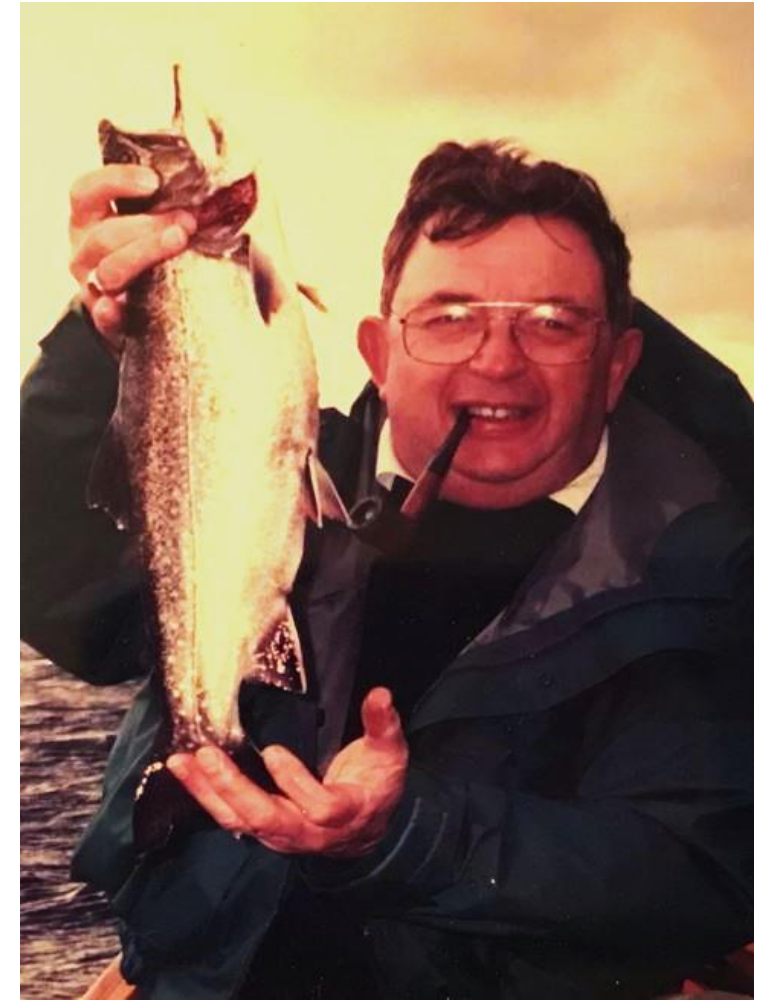
1930-2022

Charles Thomas “Tom” Jagger 1930-2022

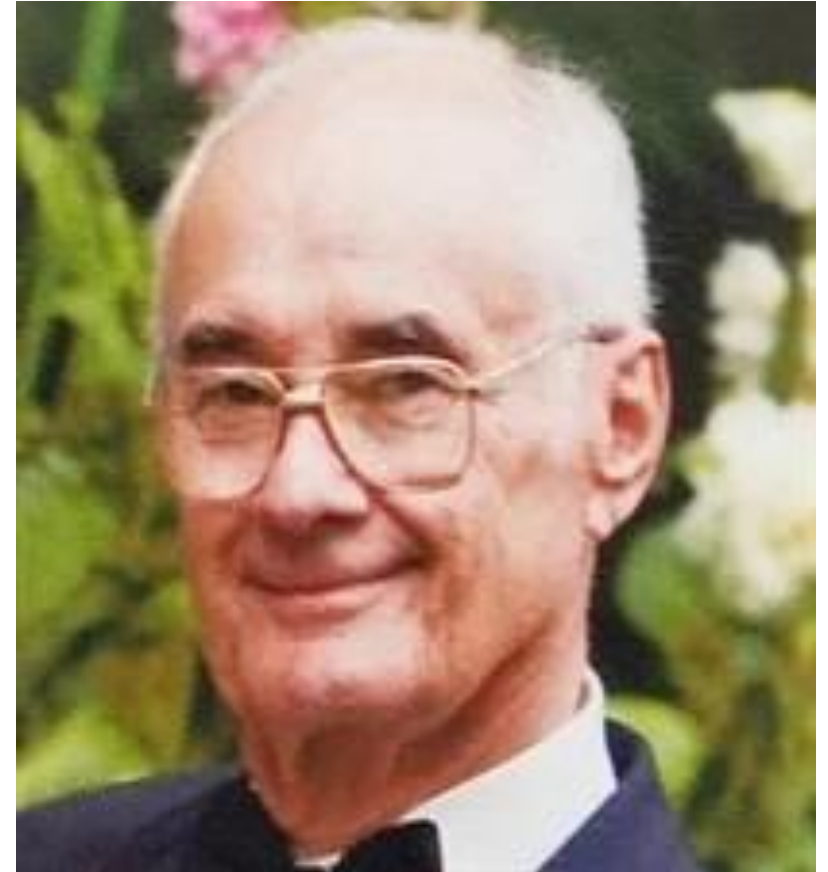
- Rotary Club of Sanford-Springvale, ME

1930 - 2023

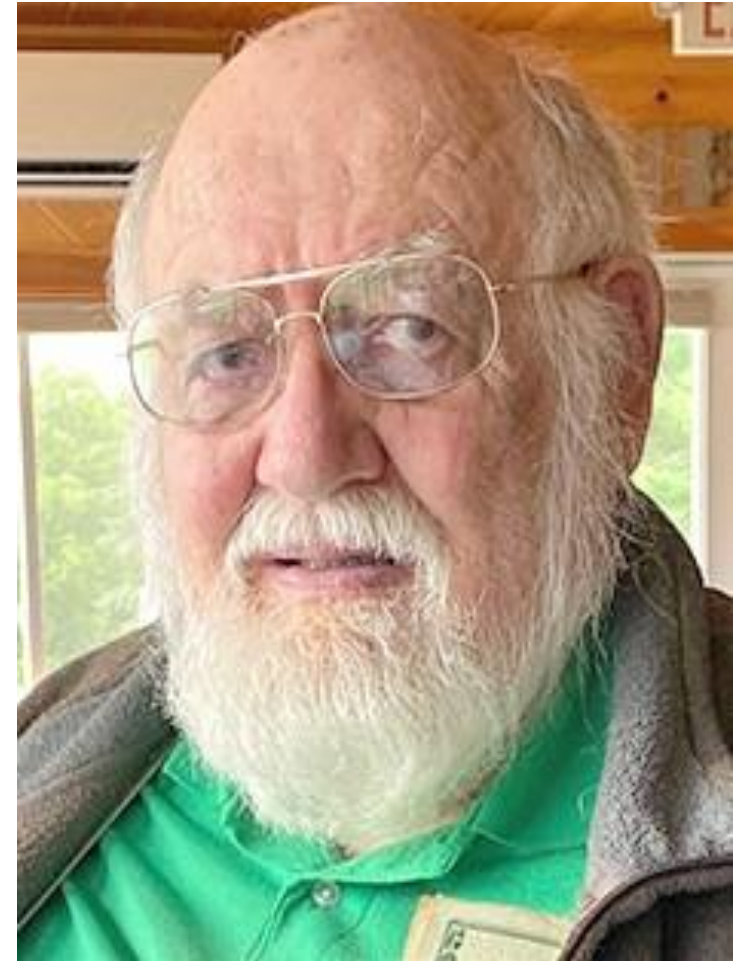
- Rotary Club of Westbrook- Gorham, ME

1939 -2023

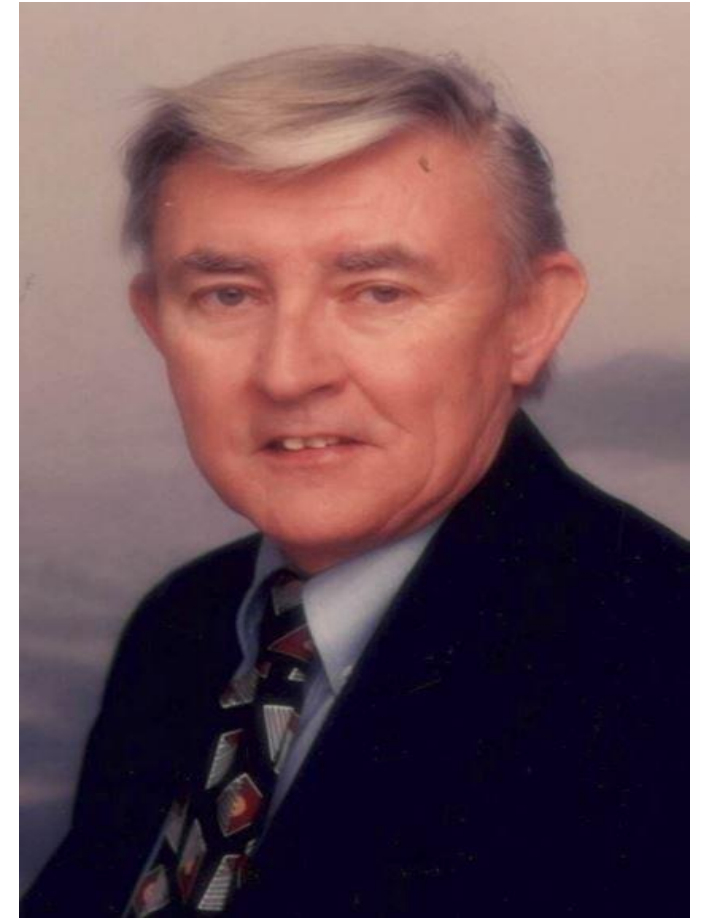
- Rotary Club of Kennebunk, ME

1941-2023

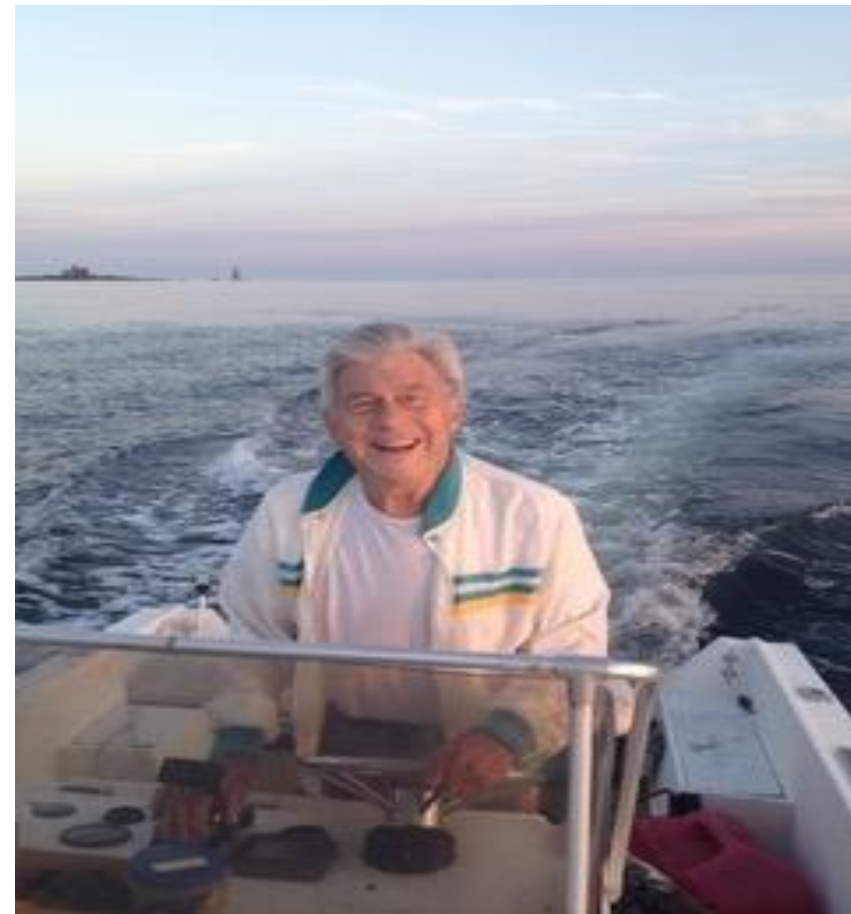
- Rotary Club of Brunswick, ME
