## PR - PUBLICIZE ROTARY

Once your club has a PR chairman, one of his jobs will be to inform the media (and therefore your community) of what your club is doing. One of the standard ways to do this is with a news release (NOT a "press release" since that tends to imply you are ignoring audio-visual media). Below is a "standard" format and some guidelines for a release that can be used.

If your club has club letterhead stationery, use that for your releases.

The major parts of a release are the heading lines, release number, date, headline (or slug line), the release in double spaced format, a "-30-" to show the end of the release, and any notes to editors and news directors you may wish to have.

Suggested format: (club letterhead)

NEWS RELEASE Rel. no. -86  
FOR IMMEDIATE RELEASE (date)

PUT HEADLINE HERE, JUST A FEW WORDS, ALL CAPS, UNDERLINED

City, State--Begin your first paragraph here. It must contain ALL the essential information -- who, why, what, when, where, how -- as appropriate. This "lead" paragraph should usually be less than 25 words.

Subsequent paragraphs include information in descending order of importance, e.g. the most important first, least important at the end (where editors tend to cut things off).

All paragraphs should be double spaced.

Keep words and sentences short and simple.

Conclude release with a centered "--30--", then a note to editors and news directors giving them any other essential information and a point of contact.

Les parties importantes sont la tête de lettre, le numéro de l'annonce, la date, la ligne en tête, le corps de l'annonce écrite intervalle entre-deux, le symbole "-30-" pour montrer la fin de l'annonce, et des notes nécessaires aux rédacteurs et aux directeurs.

Les paragraphes qui suivent comprennent l'information en ordre descendant de l'importance, la plus importante d'abord et la moins importante à la fin (où il y a risque d'être coupé par l'éditeur). L'annonce devrait être écrite intervalles entre-deux. Gardez-vous bien d'employer les mots courts et les phrases simples. A Rotary Conference for Development is scheduled in Dhaka, Bangladesh from 12-14 January 1987. Any Rotarian interested in attending may receive a registration form from me.

District 177 (East of Paris, France) has opened in the heart of Paris a ROTARY WELCOME CENTER. It is located at 38 Champs Elysees, in the building of "Maison de l'Alsace." Visiting Rotarians are invited to hold business appointments since it offers telephone, telex, photocopying, French - English - German secretarial service, tourist information and also hotel reservations as well as air, rail bookings, etc. Those going to the Munich Convention in June might also want to take in this stop.

Several clubs have expressed an interest in Rotaract - and would like to see one in operation to learn what "real world" problems might be. There are no Rotaract clubs now in District 779 (too bad), but if you are really interested, you will find them in Plattsburg, Sarnac Lake, and Rochester, NY; Toronto, Ontario and Glace Bay, Nova Scotia; Poulitney, VT; Dalton, MASS; and Danbury, CT. These are the closest to 779.

PRESIDENT MATT SAID....

We have spent many millions of dollars in saving lives and promoting international understanding and good will through student ambassadors. He added that scholars are going into non-Rotarian countries for the first time and Africans are getting three year study grants to learn how to maximize food productivity. And....the example of the once full 50 bed polio hospital in Manila that now has only 4 or 5 patients. All summed up -- GIVE MONEY!!! The Rotary Foundation and the Polio Plus program are both worthy of our extraordinary financial support.

A letter from President MATT picks up on my suggestion at the District Conference -- wouldn't it be wonderful if every Paul Harris Fellow decided to make a personal donation of \$100 per year to the Rotary Foundation. Une Conférence Rotary pour Développement aura lieu à Dhaka, Bangladesh le 12-14 janvier, 1987. Les Rotariens qui s'intéressent peuvent obtenir les formes d'enregistrement de moi.

Le District 177 (à l'est de Paris, France) vient d'ouvrir au centre de Paris un Centre d'Accueil Rotary. Il se trouve à 38 Champs Elysees, dans le bâtiment "Maison de l'Alsace." Les Rotariens en visite sont invités à y tenir les rendez-vous d'affaires puisque on offre téléphone, télex, machine à photocopier, service de secrétaire français, anglais et allemand, information touristique et aussi réservations d'hôtel, avion, chemin de fer etc. Il se peut que ceux qui vont assister à la Convention Munich en juin veuillent y faire visite.
