## **First District Conference**

October 25, 26, 27, 1991 Verrillo's Convention Center Portland, Maine

A major event of the Rotary year is the District Conference, and this year is no exception. The District 7780 meeting is truly significant, however, because it's the first "solo" conference of a brand new

district of Rotary International.

Rotarians from the 34 clubs of the new district will meet for three days in Portland for fellowship, for inspirational messages and for wide-ranging discussions of matters relating to individual clubs as well as to the District.


