

Rotary Club Hosts Intern'l Students

During the weekend of February 4, 1994 the Oxford Hills Rotary Club once again hosted international students visiting the United States and took them on a skiing excursion. This is the second year the Oxford Hills has hosted the students, according to Frank Shorey of the Rotary Club.

The students are visiting from nine countries and staying with host families in Maine and New Hampshire, says Shorey. They stayed with 10 area families and many of them got their first taste of skiing!

"Last year, some of these students had never seen snow before they got here," Shorey chuckles. "But by the end of Saturday, every student was up on skis."

The weekend began with some night skiing at Shawnee Peak in

Bridgton, then continued on Saturday with more skiing at Ski Mt. Abram in Locke Mills. On Saturday night, the day concluded with a gathering at the home of Matt and Dy-Anne Gurney in Norway, Maine, according to Shorey. The 20 students, all aged 18 or 19, hall from the Czech Republic, Indonesia, Venezuela, Brazil, Peru, Germany, Ukraine, France, and Belgium.

Currently, the Oxford Hills Rotary sponsors a student, Seth McLain of Harrison, who is studying in Belgium, while Oliver Heijmans of Belgium stays here in the Oxford Hills, according to Shorey.
