
Every District 7780 Rotarian has received their District Conference Registration and preliminary information.

All Club Presidents and Area Representatives recently received a Foundation Cap to show all members what they look like. Anyone making a \$100.00 Sustaining Paul Harris Fellow contribution will receive a Foundation Cap, after sending a copy of the contribution form to Bruce Emerson, Contribution Chair. The caps are to give recognition to those who support Our Rotary Foundation, but are not eligible to receive the PHF pin. As of February 29, the last reporting date, contributions amount to \$55,600, about 54% of our goal of \$103,000, so we need to continue our efforts toward meeting our Club's goals.

Our goal for Net Membership Gain has been achieved, but we must continue to work diligently at adequately informing our new members of their responsibilities to Rotary, in order that we still have them on June 30! In order to increase our membership level by 128, we have proposed and inducted 261 New Members into our Clubs so far this year. We have to consider how many of those 133 lost members we could have retained.


## District Governor Nominee's Corner ..... By Craig Wellman PON

This is a medical machine that is used to detect breast cancer in women. His District in Argentina encompasses quite a large, rural area where the inhabitants do not have resources to provide such screening equipment. There is a very large percentage of the population there that is affected with breast cancer, so the local Rotary Club has taken on the task of trying to set up a medical facility to screen the local residents. Since they do not have the same updated equipment (in fact, they have no equipment, to date) that is required in the U.S., they would be happy to accept an older, less modern machine that would serve their needs. I told him that I would see what my District could do to obtain such a piece of equipment. I thought at the time what a wonderful opportunity this was to make a difference to a people in a distant country. Isn't it also a coincidence that our GSE Team who will be arriving within the month also comes from Argentina? Another wonderful coincidence is that the President-Elect of R.I., Luis Vicente Guiy, also come from Argentina.

At the recent PETS I asked all of my President-Elects to ask two other people if they knew someone who could locate such a piece of equipment. Now I ask all who read this newsletter to ask two other people if they know of where there is such a machine being unused because it is out of date and no longer state of the art. I firmly believe that somewhere in our District there is someone who knows someone who knows where we can get one. Wouldn't it be a nice thing to send back to Argentina with the GSE Team, and a nice plus for the 95-96 Rotary Year.
