As you can see later in this Newsletter, we have welcomed 40 NEW MEMBERS into Rotary during



Bristol, England's Matthew Week

The sailing ship "Matthew" departed Bristol, England, under the command of John Cabot, in May of 1497 on a voyage of discovery making landfall on Newfoundland. It was a significant event in that it lead to subsequent colonization of Canada and the USA.

To celebrate the 500th anniversary of this event a consortium of Bristol businessmen decided to commemorate the voyage by commissioning the construction of a replica of the "Matthew" which, with a crew of 18, will reproduce Cabot's voyage, setting sail from Bristol for Newfoundland on Friday, May 2, 1997.

19 Rotary Clubs in the maritime Bristol area are planning a "Matthew Week", culminating in the official departure of the ship on her voyage to Newfoundland. They are inviting Rotarians from 15 Canadian and USA Seaboard Rotary Districts interested in joining Bristol Rotarians for this unique and historic event. The maritime Rotary Clubs of Portsmouth and Portland have been chosen from District 7780 to participate if there is sufficient interest (5 couples per club). Participants from other clubs would be welcome.

Air travel and lodging expenses will be the responsibility of the visitor. There have been 125 provisional reservations made at *The Swallow Royal Hotel, Bristol, England*. Entertainment and tours each day will be provided by the Bristol area Rotarians. For further information, please contact District Governor George Rice.
