

District Secretary's Corner By Patty McAllister

District Conference, I'd like to recap the highlight's of my secretary's report. With emphasis this year on membership growth, I thought it would be informative to report on the numbers. Total new members inducted this year as of 10 June, 1996 is 382. Total members terminated as of the same date is 218. Net membership gain is 164. Congratulations on reaching and surpassing the goal set of 120!

A recap of termination reasons showed 30% were because of business pressure, 25% moved or had business transfers, 20% were for personal/health reasons or deceased, and the remaining 25% were for attendance. Close to 75% of the reasons why members were terminated were beyond anyone's control, and hopefully the new 2-week window for makeup opportunities will lessen the attendance reasons.

I'd like to thank all the Club Secretaries for getting their attendance reports to me in time for the Governor's Newsletter. 100% of the reports were on

For those of you who were not able to attend the time for 4 months, 90% or better were on time for 5 months, and 75-85% for the remaining 3 months. I really appreciate their efforts and cooperation to send me the reports and membership change forms timely to keep Governor George updated, to keep the Zone Coordinator updated and to keep Rotary International updated. Thanks for a job well done!

As my year as District Secretary comes to a close, I want you all to know that I've been thrilled with the experience, with the friendships developed, the Rotary information and knowledge I've obtained, and have especially enjoyed the opportunity of working directly with Governor George. He has been so organized, so full of knowledge, and so helpful he has made my job a lot easier.
