
Governor's Notes

Clubs are asked to submit nominations for the following District 7780 Officers:

District Governor for 2005-2006 Finance Committee Member, Division A 2003-2006

Qualifications for the duties of District Governor can be found in the Manual of Procedure and include:

- Having been a member of a Rotary Club for at least 7 years prior to taking office
- Having served a full term as Club President
- Having the ability and commitment to meet additional qualifications called for upon taking office
- Be willing and physically able and otherwise to carry out the duties of District Governor.

Qualifications for Finance Committee Member include:

- Must be a Past President of a District 7780 Club in Division A (clubs in Dover, Durham-Great Bay, Exeter, Hampton, Newburyport, Portsmouth, Portsmouth Sunrise, Rochester, Seabrook-Hampton Falls and Somersworth)
- Must be willing and able to serve as a member of the committee for the specified term.

All nominations must be in the form of a resolution of the club adopted at a regular club meeting as described in the Manual of Procedure. In addition, candidates for District Governor need to provide a picture and biographical sketch of both their personal and Rotary background. All nominations must be forwarded to DG Tim prior to January 15, 2003. Please feel free to call him with any questions relative to the process.

Here are some projects undertaken by individual clubs and businesses in our communities to raise money for the Polio Eradication Campaign.

The Sanford-Springvale Rotary Club will donate all the proceeds of its yearly calendar sale to the PEC. The calendars are \$25 each, and have historical photos of the club's home area.

The Scarborough Rotary Club, with the help of one of their members, Joanne Christie, is encouraging their members to become sustaining Paul Harris Fellows. The first ten that so do, and designate the first three years to the PEC, will receive an additional \$100 from Joanne's gift.

The Oxford Hills Rotary Club will hold a cross country ski event at Carter's Cross Country Ski Center. The "Groundhogs Against Polio" day will be Sunday, February 2, 2003. Participants will be given breakfast at the main lodge, then can ski, snowshoe, or hang out at the lodge, and then will go on to warmup huts for lunch and snacks. Tickets will cost \$12.95, and include food and skiing. All the proceeds will go to the PEC. Early registrants will be given pledge sheets for fund-raising. Contact the Oxford Hills Rotary Club.

The committee has designed and produced several signs which can be used by Rotarians in their business windows, or on desks, or as displays. Please check with your area PEC coordinator for availability. There are a number of sizes which should suit every need. In addition, the chair and the designer can work with you to personalize your signs.

Among our events for the district is a Ski Day for Polio at Sunday River (see opposite page). The date will be Friday, January 24th, 2003. Sunday River and the American Ski Company are allowing Rotary to sell as many tickets as we possibly can. All the funds raised from ticket sales will go towards the Polio Eradication Campaign. Tickets will be \$40.00 for a full day of skiing. A promotional video has been produced, and was presented to the clubs, via their PEC chairs, at the Foundation Seminar on November 16th. Posters and signup sheets were included in that package. REMEMBER! Every \$40 ticket sold is \$40 toward your club's polio goal. Each ticket sold makes reaching your goal that much

Rotary In Pictures



The Wells Rotary Club has applied for one of the district's \$1,000 community grants to help build a new senior citizen center. The club has given the Wells Senior Needs Committee \$12,500 in seed money so that they could apply for various federal loans and grants in order to build the 5,000 square foot center.

With the seed money in the bank, the Senior Needs Committee, which is a non-profit outfit having nothing to do with local government, was able to get a federal block grant for \$250,000 and a federal loan (through the U.S. Department of Agriculture) of \$300,000. In addition, including Rotary's contribution, the committee has raised \$132,000 locally. The owner of the land where the senior citizen center will be built has donated the land (valued at \$150,000) to the committee.

The committee had a formal groundbreaking ceremony Nov. 21 and plans to begin construction in the spring. The fundraising goal for 2003 is \$205,000, which will be used to begin paying off the USDA loan and to operate the senior center for one year after it opens - sometime next fall.

The building will have a dining room, function room, computer stations, a

commercial kitchen (capable of being used by Rotary), an office and reception area, a crafts room and a reading room. The above photo of the official groundbreaking doesn't show a physical foundation for the senior citizen center, but it does show a human foundation; that is, how well organized the Senior Needs Committee is and how much support this project is receiving from the local community.
