After being diagnosed with cancer, he did what anyone who knows Bill would have expected: he organized a group and returned to El Salvador to build a roof on the health clinic! Bill is an active member of Brunswick Coastal Rotary, always cheerfully volunteering on projects and fundraisers. Bill's continued interest in helping others and his courage in facing his terminal illness has been a touching and inspiring example for all who know him.

With the help of over 50 local area businesses who donated desserts and items for the Silent Auction, Brunswick Coastal Rotary had another successful "Desserts from Around the World" fundraiser. Our guests were treated to music on the deck by Kat Logan, Jim Loney, and John Dennen. The proceeds from this event, held on June 16th at the Bowdoin College Cram Alumni House, will be used to support our club's local and international humanitarian projects. Within the past two years Brunswick Coastal Rotary has provided the Oasis Free Clinic with a patient information computer facility; meals for Tedford Shelter residents; new school and sports clothing, and school supplies to homeless teens through the Merrymeeting Project; drilled five water wells in a refugee camp and at an orphans' elementary school in Uganda, and outfitted 250 Community Outreach workers with medical kits to care for AIDS patients in South Africa.

# **Boothbay Harbor Fills Transport Needs of Summer Workers**

The Boothbay Region's seasonal economy relies heavily on international workers who come here each summer to work in our restaurants and resorts. Few of these workers have transportation to get to the grocery store or to do their errands, a problem compounded by the fact that the resorts where they live and work tend to be "off the beaten track" at the far reaches of our peninsula.

Boothbay Harbor Rotarian Seth Hedgcock, who frequently gives these young workers a "lift" when he passed them in his truck, realized that our Rotary Club could do something more. The club agreed! We advertised for used bikes, which Seth renovated and lent to these workers for them to use during their stay. Last year we got the initiative started; this summer we collected, refurbished, and distributed a total of 36 bikes and helmets! When you assume that each bike will be used by several workers, that's a lot of wheels. Seth also gave each of the recipients his phone number and asked them to call if they experienced a flat or other misadventure, and he has arranged to pick up the bikes at summer's end so that he can put new air in the tires and make them available to be borrowed again next year.

Way to go, Seth! That's the Rotary way: See a need, find a solution.
